
**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY  
TO PROVIDE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES**

This matter came before the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority") at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on June 7, 2012. An Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to provide facilities-based and resold local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services in Tennessee was filed by Madison River Communications, LLC (the "Company") on May 12, 2000. During a Hearing held on August 4, 2000, the Hearing Officer found that the Company had met all the requirements for certification and approved the Application. A name change to Madison River Communications, LLC d/b/a CenturyLink MRC was approved by the Authority on October 26, 2009 in Docket No. 09-00144. On April 11, 2012, the Authority received a request to cancel the Company's CCN.<sup>1</sup> Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to grant the Company's request to cancel its CCN.
