**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY
TO PROVIDE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES**


This matter came before Chairman James M. Allison, Director Kenneth C. Hill and Director Robin Bennett of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on March 7, 2014. An Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to provide facilities-based and resold local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services in Tennessee was filed by American Fiber Systems, Inc. ("AFS" or the "Company") on November 1, 2000. During a Hearing held on January 10, 2001, the Hearing Officer found that the Company had met all the requirements for certification and approved the Application.

AFS and its parent companies merged with and into Zayo Group, LLC ("Zayo"), with Zayo surviving the mergers.¹ On April 12, 2013, the Authority received a request from Zayo to cancel the Company's CCN since AFS no longer exists as a separate corporate entity. Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the Directors voted unanimously to grant the request for cancellation.
