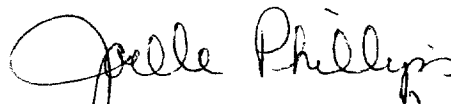

MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION OR RECONSIDERATION

BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth") submits this Motion for Clarification or Reconsideration and respectfully shows the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority") as follows:

1. On July 10, 2001, at its Agenda Conference, the Authority considered three Contract Service Arrangements ("CSAs") (Items 5, 6 and 7 on the Agenda) submitted for approval by BellSouth. Upon review of the transcript, BellSouth respectfully requests clarification from the Authority regarding whether approval of those CSAs was denied or merely held in abeyance. The colloquy between the Directors on this matter is set forth on Pages 20 through 22 of the transcript, attached as Exhibit "A."

2. To the extent that the Authority intended to deny approval of the CSAs, rather than hold the matter in abeyance, BellSouth respectfully requests that the Authority reconsider and, instead, hold the matter in abeyance until August 15, 2001. BellSouth is preparing to file a tariff addressing this issue on or about August 1, 2001, and August 15, 2001 is the date BellSouth anticipates that the new tariff would become effective. Going forward, BellSouth will proceed with the

understanding that all CSAs approved after the tariff effective date will be subject to the new tariff to the extent such CSAs address services in Tennessee.

1 liability provisions in those tariff term plans.
2 Customers that signed up for and wanted to avail
3 themselves of that 2001 key promotion would be subject
4 to the termination liability provisions that do not
5 include the buyouts.

6 DIRECTOR MALONE: I don't have any
7 further questions of Mr. Hicks. I have a motion if
8 there are other questions of Mr. Hicks before that
9 time.

10 (No response.)

11 DIRECTOR MALONE: Thank you,
12 Mr. Hicks.

13 MR. HICKS: Thank you.

14 DIRECTOR MALONE: It appears to me
15 that the -- Madam Chairman, are we taking 5, 6, and 7
16 separately or together?

17 CHAIRMAN KYLE: Be glad to take them
18 together.

19 DIRECTOR MALONE: It appears to me
20 that Agenda Items 5, 6, and 7 are from the standpoint
21 of the underlying termination provisions permitting a
22 90 or 100 percent buyout are on all fours with the key
23 business discount. And in that situation, BellSouth
24 agreed that the underlying tariff termination
25 provisions will not be applicable but that they would

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1 conform with the rule that has been adopted by the
2 Authority.

3 I see no material reason why these
4 CSAs should not also conform to that offering by
5 BellSouth, particularly in light of the fact that these
6 are not CSAs that were filed before the Agency adopted
7 the rule. These are not CSAs that were filed before
8 BellSouth and staff submitted the settlement agreement.

9 And BellSouth has always communicated
10 to this Agency that upon the adoption of the rule, that
11 it would conform its practices to the rule, not upon
12 the effective date of the rule but upon the adoption of
13 the rule. And these three CSAs fly in the face of that
14 offer and are inconsistent with what BellSouth agreed
15 to do last week and the key business discount.

16 So approving these CSAs, I would be
17 glad to do so, so that the customers can get these
18 discounts. But to approve these CSAs and remain intact
19 termination provisions that are clearly inconsistent
20 with the rule and clearly inconsistent with what
21 BellSouth has agreed to do, would be a
22 misrepresentation to this Agency.

23 So last week BellSouth agreed to
24 modify the key business discount consistent with the
25 rule. And I would suggest that either BellSouth can

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1 agree to do that with these CSAs and they can be
2 approved, or that these CSAs be either held in abeyance
3 or denied.

4 DIRECTOR GREER: Maybe the secret now
5 is that we call Mr. Howorth. Maybe we can get another
6 answer out of Mr. Howorth consistent with his answer
7 last week.

8 As I understood last week, or the last
9 time we had this, both key business discount and this
10 are both volume and term contracts. And based on the
11 answer that Mr. Howorth gave us two weeks ago, I'm
12 going to vote to second your motion.

13 CHAIRMAN KYLE: I'm not with that
14 motion. I would be for approval of these as they
15 stand. Next item.

16 MR. WADDELL: 01-00543, Tennessee
17 Water Service, Inc., petition for authority to transfer
