NOTICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE CLOSURE OF DOCKET

This matter is before the Tennessee Public Utility Commission upon a letter (“Request to Cancel”), filed September 7, 2023, requesting cancellation of the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (“CCN”) issued to BullsEye Telecom, Inc. (“BullsEye”) due to an internal reorganization that resulted in the complete transfer of BullsEye’s customer base to Lingo Telecom, LLC d/b/a LingoComm d/b/a BullsEye (“Lingo”). Since the filing of the Request to Cancel, Commission Staff has periodically communicated with representatives of AT&T Tennessee to determine whether BullsEye had completed the necessary transfer documentation and ceased receiving resale and/or wholesale services from AT&T Tennessee.


On September 8, 2025, Commission Staff issued a letter to the consultant who filed the Request to Cancel on behalf of BullsEye, requesting proof of completion and filing of the Transfer Agreement and Assignment Amendment that AT&T Tennessee advised were required. The letter further advised that if proof of completion was not filed

on or before September 24, 2025, the Request to Cancel may be denied without prejudice.

Commission Staff has patiently issued follow-up inquiries with AT&T Tennessee, as it appeared that some progress had been made on the transfer documentation. However, after months of continued inquiries, all documents necessary to complete the transfer of resale and/or wholesale services from BullsEye to Lingo remain incomplete.

Therefore, because BullsEye has not responded to the September 8, 2025 data request for evidence of completion of the Transfer Agreement and Assignment Amendment, the Request to Cancel is denied without prejudice, and this docket is administratively closed. BullsEye may file a new request to cancel its CCN once it has executed and submitted the necessary documentation with AT&T Tennessee to complete the transfer of its customers.
