
**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AMENDMENT TO
CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY**

This matter came before Chairman Sara Kyle, Director Eddie Roberson and Director Pat Miller of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on August 23, 2006. IRM Utility, Inc. (the "Company") filed a Petition to amend its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to expand its service area to include a portion of Blount County, Tennessee, known as LashBrooke Subdivision on August 25, 2004. At a Hearing held on January 31, 2005, the Directors provisionally approved the Petition pending receipt of a state operating permit issued by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation.¹ On July 6, 2006, the Company requested that the TRA cancel the amendment to its CCN. Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to grant the Company's request to cancel the amendment to its CCN which expanded its service area to include a portion of Blount County, Tennessee, known as LashBrooke Subdivision.
