This matter came before Chairman Eddie Roberson, Director Sara Kyle and Director Ron Jones of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (“TRA”), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on October 22, 2007. Startec Global Licensing Company (the “Company”) originally filed an Application for authority to resell interexchange long distance telecommunications services in Tennessee on September 7, 2004. During a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on November 22, 2004, the Directors found that the Company had met all the requirements for certification and the requirements of Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1220-4-2-.57, which was promulgated pursuant to, *inter alia*, Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-2-102 and Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-201, and approved the Application. On August 27, 2007, the Company requested that the TRA cancel its authority.<sup>1</sup> Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to grant the Company’s request to cancel its authority.
