Dear Chairman Jones:

On October 19, 2005, BellSouth filed a letter pointing out that CompSouth's witness, Mr. Joseph Gillian's response to the Authority's *Notice of Filing* went well beyond the question presented. BellSouth stated that, rather than filing a motion to strike the nonresponsive and inappropriate sections of CompSouth's filing, BellSouth would file a response so that the Authority would have information from both BellSouth and CompSouth to evaluate.

CompSouth's post-hearing attempt to inject some uncertainty concerning BellSouth's Form 477 reporting made to the FCC cannot pass muster. BellSouth's Form 477 Report UNE Loop Count Data as of December 2004 fully matches the stand-alone loop counts presented by BellSouth in this proceeding. BellSouth's Form 477 input did not include EELs. EELs are not explicitly required to be reported in the FCC Form 477 data, and BellSouth has not historically included in its Form 477 reporting. BellSouth is in the process of preparing Form 477 Reports that will include EELs data and will happily furnish this information to the Authority after it is filed. BellSouth's business line data fully comports with the FCC directives and with other reports filed with the FCC.

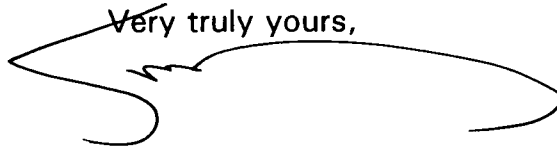
