Dear Chairman Roberson:

I have enclosed for filing a copy of the newspaper notice of the new commercial tariff filed by Tennessee Wastewater Systems, Inc. ("TWS"). The notice appeared in <u>The Mountain Press</u>, located in Sevier County, on September 5 and 6 and will run again on September 7, 2007. The notice explains that the new tariff, if approved, will apply to commercial customers classified as "overnight rental properties" and will provide them with a cheaper rate than is currently charged to other commercial customers. The notice informs affected customers that the TRA will consider the proposed tariff on September 10, 2007, and also provides the customer with information about how to contact the TRA and comment on the new tariff.

I have also enclosed for filing in this docket a copy of an amendment to the new tariff which conforms to the decision of the Authority on August 20, 2007. At that meeting, the TRA asked that the new tariff state that before TWS charges any customer for enlarging the customer's septic tank, TWS must explain the proposed charge and inform the customer of his right to challenge the charge by filing a complaint with the TRA. This amendment was filed at the TRA on September 5, 2007, and was included in the description of the tariff published in the newspaper.

PUBLIC NOTICE

On September 10, 2007 at 1:00 p.m., the Tennessee Regulatory Authority will hold a public hearing on the ground floor of its offices at .460 James Rebertson Parkway, Nashville Tennessae Nashville, Tennessee. The purpose of the hearing is to consider a revised commercial tariff proposed by Tennessee Wastewater Systems. The revised tariff creates a subcategory of commercial ciustomers called "overnight rental properties" and would apply to commercial properties meeting the definition of "evernight rentals" set forth: in T.C.A. 585-4-702(a)(11). The tariff would not apply to properties classified as residen-

A complete copy of the revised tariff is available for public Inspection at the TRA and is available on the agency's website (www.state.tn.us/tra) under Docket number 05-06259.

The new tariff makes the following changes in

the rates, terms, and condiffions now applicable to all commercial quatomers. The new terrill reduces the minimum rate applicable to overnight rental, commercial customers from \$75.00 per month to average daily usage up to 300 gallons per day over a thirty-day period. The new tariff also provides that charges above the minimum amount will be based on the customer's usage rather than on the capacity of the facilities serving that customer, as provided in the tariff applicable to other commercial. customers. Finally, the new tanti states that if TWS proposes to charge a customer for repairs or improvements to the portion of the sewer plant dedicated to serving that customer, TWS must notify the customer in writing of the proposed charge and inform the customer that if he or she objects to the proposed charge, the customer may file a complaint with the Tonnessee Regulatory Authority. The tariff applicable to other commercial customers does not include this notice requirement.

SECTION 6 – COMMERCIAL RATES SHEET

Overnight Rental Units

The monthly sewer charge per customer is based on the monthly average daily flow monitored from the unit being served. A minimum of \$55 per month will be charged for up to the first 300 gallons per day of average daily flow. For each additional 100 gallons per day of average daily flow, up to a total of 1,000 gallons per day, an additional charge of \$15.00 per month per 100 gallons will be levied. For average daily flows over 1,000 gallons per day, the following additional monthly charges per 1,000 gallons of average daily flow will apply.

If a customer's usage exceeds the average daily design flow for three consecutive months, the customer may be required to pay any capital costs associated with increasing the capacity of that portion of the system designed and dedicated to serve that customer.

If TWS determines that a customer's usage meets the criteria described above, TWS will notify the customer in writing of any proposed construction work, the reasons for the work, and the estimated cost to the customer. The notice will also state that if the customer believes that his usage does not meet the criteria described above or that the charge to the customer is unjust and unreasonable, the customer may file a written complaint with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, located at 460 James Robertson Parkway, Nashville, TN, 37253. Unless the TRA orders otherwise, the filing of a complaint will not delay the proposed construction work but may initiate a proceeding in which the TRA will determine whether, under the terms of this tariff, the customer is responsible for the cost of the construction work.

Fees: Nonpayment -5%

Reconnection - \$15

Disconnection - \$10

Returned Check - \$20

All rates are subject to a \$0.41 bonding fee
