Gavillet, G-A-V-I-L-E-T. I'm the executive vice president and general counsel.

HEARING OFFICER: Would you please describe the managerial, technical, and financial qualifications of Neutral Tandem-Tennessee?

MR. GAVILLET: I'd be happy to. Neutral Tandem-Tennessee is a wholly-owned LLC of Neutral Tandem, Inc., of which I'm also the general counsel of.

We have on our management team starting with our CEO, Rian Wren, a gentleman who had over 20 years experience with AT&T, eventually assuming the position as president of the southeast and southwest divisions of AT&T. He later went to Comcast Communications where he was for approximately five years. He managed their voice communications services before assuming the position as president and CEO of Neutral Tandem.

Rob Junkroski, our CFO, has approximately nearly 20 years -- I think it's about 17 years -- as a financial officer, including approximately 10 years as an officer of communications companies, most recent of which before joining Neutral Tandem was Focal Communications in Chicago, which was a national communications company, a CLEC.

1 I myself have 20 years experience in 2 telecommunications all as an attorney both in private 3 practice as well as with communications companies, 4 twice with MCI in different legal capacities, 5 regulatory and senior legal manager. And --6 HEARING OFFICER: I'm sorry. Can I 7 interrupt you just a second? When you refer to Neutral 8 Tandem, are you talking about Neutral Tandem, Inc. or 9 are you talking specifically about Neutral Tandem-Tennessee, the subsidiary? 10 11 MR. GAVILLET: Both. The management 12 team operates both. 13 HEARING OFFICER: okay. 14 MR. GAVILLET: Actually, 15 interestingly, Neutral Tandem, Inc. itself is not a 16 certified carrier. All the certificates are held in 17 underlying LLCs. But the management team, you know, 18 facilitates the operations of both. 19 Then the last gentleman whose 20 background I wanted to mention was Surendra Saboo, who 21 is our chief operating officer and executive vice 22 president. Like Mr. Wren, he had a long career at AT&T

confident that the applicant has the requisite technical, financial, and managerial capability.

the managerial qualifications. Now, what about the technical and the financial?

MR. GAVILLET: Sure. On a technical basis, we currently are operating across the country. We provide service in about 45 LATAs utilizing 14 switching columns. We deployed both Nortel DMS-500 as well as SONA softswitches to provide our services. I'm very happy to say that we've never had a commission complaint lodged against us and we've never had a billing dispute with our customers.

One of the reasons for our success, I think, is we've principally provided service to carriers. We have about 54 customers right now. They're all the carriers you would recognize. Everyone from AT&T to Cingular to, you know, Sedion (phonetic) for example, the voiceover IP company. Our principal service facilitates the exchange of traffic between those carriers.

Before we entered the market, they largely had to rely on the Bell company to provide that service. It's called transit service. We enter a market and provision high capacity fiberoptic lines

between our switch and all the competitive switches in the marketplace. Then those carriers that are our customers exchange traffic with one another through our tandem switch -- you know, thus the name Neutral Tandem -- versus the Bell company tandem. So the successful operation of that service, I think, is a demonstration of our technical expertise.

Our financials, I think, speak for themselves. As of the nine-month financials, we had this year 38 million in revenue and 5.6 million in net income. We'll finish the year with just about 53 million in revenue. There are very few telecommunications companies that are net income positive. We've succeeded at that.

HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Now, what are your business plans in Tennessee?

MR. GAVILLET: We anticipate operating in Tennessee much like we have in our other markets. I will tell you we'll most likely lease space in at least two cities starting with Nashville. We'll most likely lease space in a carrier -- what's termed a carrier hotel where a number of carrier switches are located and where we can access a variety of fiberoptic carriers.

Our desire is to utilize as many

different fiberoptic carriers as possible in a market in order to minimize the risk of disruption of our network. In many markets, we utilize over 10 different fiberoptic carriers. We have over 30 different fiberoptic carriers nationally that we utilize.

we'll lease the space. We'll provision or install most likely a SONA softswitch which will operate as a tandem switch. We'll then order fiberoptic connections between our switch and all competitive, both wireless and wire line switches, in the marketplace. And, based on our experience, within six months, we'll probably have nearly every switch on our network because nearly every carrier in the market is currently a customer.

HEARING OFFICER: What is the time frame for beginning operations in Tennessee?

MR. GAVILLET: We had hoped to actually be certified around now. I would anticipate that we'll probably enter into a lease by the end of the first quarter. And 60 days after we enter into a lease provided it's already conditioned, built-out space, we'll have our switch installed. So most definitely by the 4th of July we'll be providing service in the state.

MR. GAVILLET: I'd be happy to. I believe those have to do with general rules regarding uniform system of accounts. As a practice as a competitive carrier, we do keep our books in a GAAP format versus the uniform system of accounts basis which is traditionally the accounting practices of local exchange -- incumbent local exchange carriers.

So it would be a burden for us to adopt a different accounting system for a single state like this. That's the reason for that waiver.

HEARING OFFICER: Now, TRA Rule

1220-4-2-.09 has to do with billing recording

equipment. The rule states: "Where mechanical and

electronic means are used for recording information

that will affect a customer's bill, such equipment

shall be frequently inspected to see that it is

functioning properly." You requested a waiver of that

rule as well.

MR. GAVILLET: I'm sorry. I think that's probably unnecessary. Our billing system is regularly reviewed and certainly I see no need for such a waiver.

HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Does Neutral Tandem-Tennessee plan to offer voice grade services at

this time?

MR. GAVILLET: Not to residential and small business users. Our tandem services, which the principal -- actually, schools of customers -- are carriers. It is voice grade. It's a voice grade, but it's not dial tone services.

At this time, we don't -- we don't intend to offer dial tone services. Our initial services in the market will be local exchange access and transit services which will all be voice grade.

HEARING OFFICER: What about in the future? Does Neutral Tandem plan to offer voice grade services to residential customers?

MR. GAVILLET: It's highly unlikely we'll ever offer voice grade services to residential customers. Our name suggests our business objective and that's to be neutral and not compete with our customers who themselves offer such services. So I don't anticipate in the near future offering dial tone residential services.

HEARING OFFICER: If Neutral

Tandem-Tennessee plans to offer voice grade services in
the future to residential customers, do you agree to
notify the Authority 60 days prior to offering such
services and indicate that you will offer Lifeline and

1 Link-Up services, White Page listing, access to 911 2 services, and free 900/976 number blocking and 3 educational discounts that were in existence as of 4 June 6, 1995? 5 MR. GAVILLET: Yes. 6 HEARING OFFICER: Also does Neutral 7 Tandem-Tennessee agree to notify the Authority within a 8 year from the date of this hearing if it does offer --9 if it does not offer voice grade services to 10 residential customers? 11 MR. GAVILLET: Yes. If I could just 12 get a clarification. So within one year of this 13 hearing or the order? 14 HEARING OFFICER: Within the hearing. 15 MR. GAVILLET: Within one year of the 16 hearing, if we're not offering voice grade services to 17 residential customers, it's our obligation to notify 18 the commission? 19 HEARING OFFICER: We request that you 20 notify the commission because this allows the TRA to keep track of the tariffs and to be able to determine 21 why there are not tariffs for certain CLECs that are 22 23 operating in the state. 24 MR. GAVILLET: Absolutely. We agree.


