Pursuant to applicable Tennessee Statutes and the Rules and Regulations of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority and Section 253 of the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 ("Act"), OneTone, Inc. ("OneTone") respectfully requests that the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA") amend the certificate to provide resold local exchange services already held by OneTone (issued in TRA Docket No. 06-00023) and grant to OneTone authority to provide competing local telecommunications services, including exchange access telecommunications services, within the State of Tennessee. OneTone is willing and able to comply with all applicable rules and regulations in Tennessee pertaining to the provision of competing local telecommunications services.

2. <u>Organizational Chart of Corporate Structure</u>

See Exhibit A attached hereto.

3. Corporate information:

OneTone Telecom, Inc. ("OneTone") was incorporated in the state of South Carolina on March 4, 1996. A copy of OneTone's Articles of Incorporation and Amendments are provided in **Exhibit B**. A copy of OneTone's Authority to transact business in the State of Tennessee is provided in **Exhibit C**. The names and addresses of the principal corporate officers are attached as **Exhibit D**. OneTone has no officers in Tennessee. The biographies of the principal officers and any other key technical staff are found in **Exhibit E**.

4. One Tone possesses the managerial, technical, and financial ability to provide local telecommunications service in the State of Tennessee as demonstrated below:

A. Financial Qualifications:

In support of its financial qualifications, OneTone submits its Income Statement and Balance Sheet as **Exhibit F.**

On November 14, 2003, OneTone Telecom, Inc. was presented with an award for being the 23rd Fastest-Growing Company in South Carolina. Elliot Davis, the state's leading full-service accounting and consulting firm, and the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce sponsored the award. Firms are judged on an exclusive ranking system that tabulates results based on a combination of increases in gross revenue or assets and full-time employees. Through distinction and quality, OneTone has paved the way for excellence within their corporation. With the combination of increasing their revenue, assets, and full-time employees and their excellent customer service philosophy, OneTone has created a recipe for success. (Also attached as part of Exhibit F)

Thus, OneTone asserts that it has the financial resources necessary to operate as a competitive local service provider in Tennessee.

OneTone plans to negotiate or adopt a resale and interconnection agreement with BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. and to offer local services to Tennessee customers. Because the terms and conditions of such an agreement

are yet to be determined, OneTone has not developed projections relating to reciprocal compensation.

Exhibit G is a capital expenditure budget for 2006, 2007 and 2008, indicating type of equipment to be purchased, cost, and sources for funding of projected capital expenditures.

Neither OneTone's financials nor their projected financials reflect any revenues or expenses associated with reciprocal compensation.

A copy of the Corporate Surety Bond is provided as **Exhibit H**. The original Surety Bond was filed with the Reseller Application filed on January 25, 2006 with the TRA.

B. Managerial Ability:

As shown in **Exhibit E** to this Application, OneTone has the managerial expertise to successfully operate a telecommunications enterprise in Tennessee. As described in the attached biographical information, OneTone's management team has extensive management and business experience in telecommunications.

C. Technical Qualifications:

OneTone services will satisfy the minimum standards established by the TRA. The Company will file and maintain tariffs in the manner prescribed by the TRA and will meet minimum basic local standards, including quality of service and billing standards required of all LEC'S regulated by the TRA. Applicant will not require customers to purchase CPE, which cannot be used with the Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier's systems. As noted in the biographies of **Exhibit E** of the principal officers, there are two officers with engineering backgrounds and three officers with many years of telecommunications expertise. Thus, OneTone is certainly technically qualified to provide local exchange service in Tennessee.

5. <u>Proposed Service Area:</u>

OneTone is already authorized to provide telecommunications services in South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia, and Kentucky.

OneTone seeks authority to offer its services throughout the State of Tennessee in all local exchanges that are open to competition. Initially, however, OneTone plans to negotiate or adopt a local exchange resale and interconnection agreement with BellSouth and to offer services to customers in BellSouth's certificated areas. OneTone does not currently plan to construct its own facilities in Tennessee.

6. <u>Types of Local Exchange Service to be provided:</u>

OneTone is seeking authority to provide business and residential local exchange telecommunications services, including prepaid local services to Tennessee consumers pursuant to a negotiated or adopted resale and interconnection agreement with BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. and potentially other incumbent local exchange companies ("ILECSs") in Tennessee.

OneTone respectfully requests that the TRA waive any customer billing, deposit, advance payment or other rules that are inconsistent with the offering of prepaid local services.

7. Repair and Maintenance:

OneTone understands the importance of effective customer service for local service customers. OneTone has made arrangements for its customers to call the company at its toll-free customer service number 1-888-216-1037. In addition, customers may contact the company in writing at the headquarters address, as well as via email at www.ltone.net. The toll-free number will be printed on the customer's monthly billing statements. The Tennessee contact person knowledgeable about OneTone's operations is Travis Crane, Chief Operating Officer, see (1.) above.

Small and Minority-Owned Telecommunications Business Participation Plan: (65-2-212): See **Exhibit I** attached hereto. This Plan was filed as an exhibit to the Reseller Application on January 25, 2006.

- 8. Toll Dialing Parity Plan: See **Exhibit J** attached hereto.
- 9. Applicant has served notice of this application to the eighteen (18) incumbent local exchange telephone companies in Tennessee with a statement regarding the Company's intention of operating geographically. See **Exhibit K** for the list.
- 10. Numbering Issues: Statement provided in **Exhibit L** attached hereto.
- 11. <u>Tennessee Specific Operational Issues</u>: Statements provided in <u>Exhibit M</u> attached hereto.

12. Miscellaneous:

A. Sworn Pre-filed testimony: See **Exhibit N** attached hereto.

- B. Applicant may require customer deposits as stated in its tariff, subject to TRA regulations.
- C. In the event OneTone Telecom, Inc. resells Lifeline service to any end user in Tennessee, BellSouth will begin applying the agreed discount rate to all services. Upon OneTone Telecom, Inc. and BellSouth's implementation of a billing arrangement whereby a separate Master Account (Q-Account) associated with a separate Operating Customer Number (OCN) is established for billing of Lifeline Service end users, the discount shall be applied as set forth for the non-Lifeline affected Master Account (Q-Account).
- D. One Tone has not been subject to complaints in any of the states in which we are doing business.
- E. Our tariff was filed on January 25, 2006 with the Reseller Application and is on file with the TRA.

CONCLUSION:

The grant of this Application will further the goals of the Tennessee Legislature and further the public interest by expanding the availability of competitive telecommunications services in the State of Tennessee.

OneTone Telecom, Inc. requests that the TRA enter an order granting it a certificate of convenience and necessity to operate as a competing telecommunications service provider and authority to provide a full range of local services (including prepaid local services) on a facilities-based basis throughout the State of Tennessee in the service areas of BellSouth, Sprint and any other ILEC that does not enjoy a rural exemption under Section 251(f) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996. For the reasons stated above, OneTone's provision of these services would promote the public interest by providing high-quality service at competitive prices and by creating greater economic incentives for the development and improvement for all competing providers.

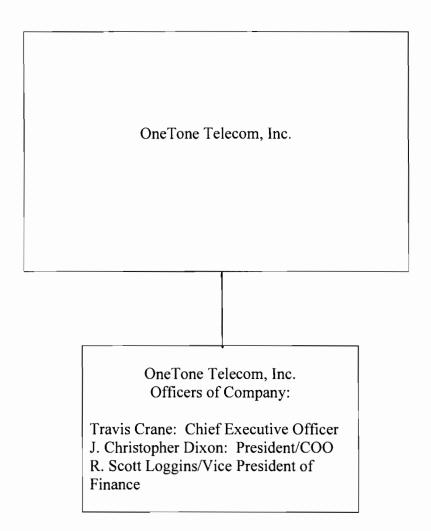

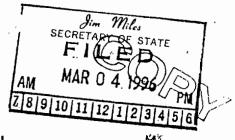

SMALL AND MINORITY-OWNED TELECOMMUNICATION BUSINESS PARTICIPATION PLAN

Pursuant to T.C.A. §65-5-212, as amended, OneTone Telecom, Inc. ("OneTone") submits this small and minority-owned Telecommunications business participation plan (the "Plan") along with its Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to resell intrastate and local exchange services in Tennessee.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of §65-5-212 is to provide opportunities for small and minority-owned businesses to provide goods and services to Telecommunications service providers. One Tone is committed to the goals of §65-5-212 and to taking steps in the Telecommunications Industry. One Tone will endeavor to provide opportunities for small and minority-owned Telecommunications businesses to compete for contracts and subcontracts for goods and services. II. DEFINITIONS

As defined in §65-5-212.

Minority-Owned Business. Minority-owned business shall mean a business which is soley owned, or at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the assets or outstanding stock of which is owned, by an individual who personally manages and controls daily operations of such business, and who is impeded from normal entry into the economic mainstream because of race, religion, sex or national origin and such business has annual gross receipts of less than four million dollars (\$4,000,000).

Small Business. Small Business shall mean a business with annual gross receipts of less than four million dollars (\$4,000,000).

III. ADMINISTRATION

OneTone's Plan will be overseen and administered by the individual named below, hereinafter referred to as the Administrator, who will be responsible for carrying out and promoting OneTone's full efforts to provide equal opportunities for small and minorityowned businesses. - (3) Preparing and submitting such forms as may be required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, including the filing of required annual updates.
- (4) Serving as the primary liaison to and cooperate with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, other agencies of the State of Tennessee, and small and minority-owned businesses to locate and use qualified small and minority-owned businesses as defined in §65-5-212.
- (5) Searching for and developing opportunities to use small and minorityowned businesses and encouraging such businesses to participate in and bid on contracts and subcontracts.
- (6) Providing records and reports and cooperate in any authorized surveys as required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority.
- (7) Establishing a record-keeping system to track qualified small and minority-owned businesses and efforts to use such businesses.

(8) Providing information and educational activities to persons within OneTone and training such persons to seek out, encourage, and promote the use of small and minority-owned businesses.

In performance of these duties, the Administrator will utilize a number of resources, including:

The efforts to promote and ensure equal opportunities for small and minorityowned businesses are primarily spelled out in the Administrator's duties above. Additional efforts to provide opportunities to small and minority-owned businesses will include offering, where appropriate and feasible, small and minority-owned businesses assistance with technical, insurance, bonding, licensing, production, and deadline requirements.

RECORDS AND COMPLIANCE REPORTS IV.

One Tone will maintain records of qualified small and minority-owned businesses and efforts to use the good sand services of such businesses. INTRALATA TOLL DIALING PARITY PLAN

OneTone does not expect to make direct requests to NANPA for NXX codes. OneTone will initially offer services primarily through BellSouth exchanges in major metropolitan areas and NPAs like 901 (Memphis) and 615 (Nashville). OneTone will not sequentially assign telephone numbers. OneTone will conserve numbering resources by using numbers on an as-needed basis as new lines are ordered by customers and processed through BellSouth as required by the interconnection agreement.

Tennessee Specific Operational Issues

1. How does the company intend to comply with TCA §65-21-114? In its description, please explain how the company will not bill for countywide calls within Tennessee.

Answer: OneTone Telecom, Inc. understands Tennessee Code Ann §65-21
114, which provides for toll-free calling within the same county in Tennessee.
OneTone plans to offer local exchange services (including prepaid local services) through an adopted or negotiated interconnection agreement with BellSouth. BellSouth's network is configured so as to comply with county-wide calling regulations. Customer billing will likewise be in compliance. OneTone will subscribe to the TAR Code Data Base that BellSouth supplies. Attached is a statement signed by the Company's CEO that was filed with the Reseller Application as an Amendment to the Application on February 15, 2006 stating that the Company will subscribe to the TAR Code Data Base that BellSouth supplies.

2. Is the company aware of the Tennessee County Wide Calling database maintained by BellSouth and the procedures to enter your telephone numbers on the database?

Answer: One Tone's interconnection agreement with BellSouth will take into account BellSouth's County Wide Calling database. Prior to the approval of such agreement by the TRA, One Tone's personnel will become familiar with the database and procedures for entering numbers and complying with the TRA countywide rules.

Answer: As a provider of local exchange services, OneTone will utilize BellSouth's database and procedures to insure that no customer is billed for toll charges within metro calling areas.
