ORDER APPROVING TARIFF FOR 811 ABBREVIATED DIALING SERVICE


This matter came before Chairman Sara Kyle, Director Eddie Roberson and Director Ron Jones of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "TRA" or "Authority"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on March 12, 2007.


Pursuant to the Federal Communication Commission's ("FCC") Sixth Report and Order in CC Docket No. 92-105, the Authority approved the designation of "811" as the abbreviated dialing code for Tennessee's One Call notification systems ("Call Before You Dig") on August 8, 2005 in TRA Docket No. 05-00161. On February 21, 2007, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth") filed Tariff No. 2007-00074 proposing rates for arranging assignment of 811 on a central office-by-central office basis for 811 providers. The rates proposed are non-recurring and are \$379.06 per customer for service establishment and \$345.80 to program each central office for the 811 dialing arrangement. Additionally, in the event of a request by the customer to change the toll free point number, there will be a non-recurring charge of \$7.48 per central office switch. BellSouth's tariff does not propose any charges to end-users dialing 811


for assistance. The effective date of the tariff is March 12, 2007. During the March 12, 2007 Authority Conference, the panel voted to approve the tariff as filed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

The tariff filing by BellSouth to establish rates for 811 abbreviated dialing service (Tariff No. 2007-00074) is approved.
