


**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY
TO PROVIDE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES**

This matter came before Chairman Sara Kyle, Director Eddie Roberson and Director Mary W. Freeman of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on July 13, 2009. Startec Global Operating Company (the "Company") originally filed an Application for authority to resell interexchange long distance services in Tennessee on May 3, 2007. During a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on June 25, 2007, the Directors found that the Company had met all the requirements for certification and the requirements of Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1220-4-2-.57, which was promulgated pursuant to, *inter alia*, Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-2-102 and Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-201, and approved the Application. On May 21, 2009, the Company requested that the TRA cancel its authority.¹ Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to grant the Company's request to cancel its authority.

¹ A *pro forma* corporate restructuring which merged the Company with and into Americatel Corporation was approved by the TRA on February 11, 2008 in Docket No. 07-00270. Americatel Corporation emerged from the restructuring as the surviving entity and has assumed the Company's customers and operations.
