


**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY
TO PROVIDE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES**

This matter came before the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority") at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on May 21, 2012. An Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to provide competing local telecommunications services in Tennessee, including, in particular, intrastate telecommunications relay services, was filed by GoAmerica Relay Services Corp. (the "Company") on September 5, 2007. During a Hearing held on December 3, 2007, the Directors found that the Company had met all the requirements for certification and approved the Application. On April 23, 2012, the Authority received a request to cancel the Company's CCN.¹ Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to grant the Company's request to cancel its CCN.
