ORDER GRANTING APPROVAL OF NAME CHANGE


This matter came before Chairman Eddie Roberson, Director Tre Hargett, and Director Ron Jones of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on May 19, 2008, upon the petition of Network Communications International Corp. ("NCIC" or "Company") to change its name.

NCIC was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") as a reseller of telecommunications services on March 12, 1998 in Docket No. 97-07612. In an Order dated December 22, 2004, in Docket No. 04-00292, NCIC was approved to amend its CCN to include the assumed names of 1800Call4Less and Mundo Telecom. On November 7, 2007, NCIC filed an official notification in this docket stating that it is changing its name from Network Communications International Corp. d/b/a Mundo Telecom and d/b/a 1800Call4Less to Network Communications International Corp. d/b/a 1800Call4Less, relinquishing the assumed name of Mundo Telecom.

Based upon careful consideration of the record of this matter and upon a finding that the

Company has satisfied the requirements of Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1220-4-1-.08, a majority of the panel voted¹ to approve the name change.

¹ Director Jones abstained from voting and asserted that Tenn. Comp. R. & Reg. 1220-4-1-.08 does not require Directors' approval for a name change, and further asserted that requiring such approval is in direct opposition to the Authority's decision in Rulemaking Docket No. 04-00072 and is contrary to the plain language of the Rule.
