#### Question:

- 6. Concerning the Company's proposed capital additions from the November 30, 2007 test year up to the attrition year ending August 31, 2009, please provide the following:
  - a. A reconciliation of actual to budgeted capital expenditures after the end of the test year up to the most current point available.
  - b. Please provide a copy of the Company's five-year capital expenditure plan, with a complete explanation of all planned capital expenditures after year-end 2007.
  - c. A detailed description of each of the capital expenditure programs through the end of August 2009 with an assessment of the certainty that each capital expenditure will actually be made.
  - d. Please explain the adjustment to accumulated depreciation between the end of the November 2007 test year up through August 31, 2009.
  - e. Please provide workpapers showing the adjustment to accumulated deferred income taxes from the end of the test year up through August 31, 2009.

### **Second Supplemental Response:**

TAWC reserves and incorporates its prior answers and all objections previously set forth in its responses. Notwithstanding its objections and without waiving them, TAWC further states that attached to this Response is the budget to actual comparisons for April through May, which is the reconciliation of actual to budgeted capital expenditures, as requested in Question 6(a) above. TAWC previously produced the schedules for the

prior quarters, which were current at the time of production; however, TAWC is providing the most current version to supplement its prior response. The attached document, along with the information that was previously produced in Response to this question and the project memorandums produced by TAWC in response to TN-TRA-01-Q53, are all of the documents under which the TAWC operates. TAWC further states that information responsive to this Request is contained in TAWC's response to TN-TRA-01-Q52. Based upon TAWC's search for responsive documents, TAWC states that no other responsive documents exist. To the extent that TAWC discovers any additional responsive documents, it will supplement its response.

Regarding Question 6(c) above, TAWC's prior Response included a typographical error and should reference the documents attached to the response to TN-CMA-01-Q26 rather than TN-COC-01-Q26.

Within the referenced document, the operating budgets are at pages 1, 5 and 9 and the capital budgets are located at pages 4, 8 and 12. TAWC further states that information responsive to this Request is contained in TAWC's response to TN-TRA-01-Q52, which are the additions and retirements by month for the forecasted period. Additionally, the Investment Project memoranda for the large capital projects that were included in the attrition year, which was previously produced in TAWC's Response to TN-TRA-01-Q53, are also responsive to this request. These memos explain the project scope and detail in the projected expenditures. TAWC further states, upon reasonable inquiry and information and belief, that no ten-year budgets exist in TAWC's possession, custody or control.
