PUBLIC NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that Hickory Star Water Company, LLC ("Company" or "Utility") filed a petition and tariff with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority on April 7, 2008, asking that it be permitted to change water rates currently being charged in the area being serviced by the Company. On May 9, 2008, the Company filed a Motion for Interim Emergency Relief until the Authority makes a final determination regarding rates. The monthly water service rate changes and increases have been proposed because its water supplier, the City of Maynardville, has increased the rates charged the Utility by almost 50%, and the Utility's existing rate and rate structure do not produce sufficient revenue to permit the Utility to meet its operating expenses.

The hearing for the petition has been set for Monday, May 19, 2008 at 1:00 p.m. (CDT) at the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, 460 James Robertson Parkway, Nashville, TN 37243-0505.

The proposed rates increase existing rates. Under the proposed interim emergency rates, customers will be charged \$42.99 per month for a minimum 2,000 gallons; \$9.00/1,000 gallons per month for the next 8,000 gallons; \$8.14/1,000 gallons for the next 10,000 gallons; \$7.37/1,000 gallons per month for the next 30,000 gallons; and \$6.85/1,000 gallons per month for over 50,000 gallons. These rate changes will result in an average increase of \$11.20 for all 119 customer's monthly rate; for customers on the minimum rate, the increase will be \$6.23 per month.

A complete copy of the proposed tariff changes and the reasons for them are on file with the Utility's business office and with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority and are open to public inspection.
