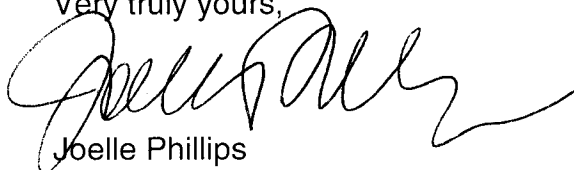
Thank you for your letter of June 10, 2009 regarding the status of the above-referenced dockets. AT&T is not the complaining party in either of these dockets and believes that dPi's complaints are without merit.

AT&T agreed in January of 2006 to hold Docket 05-00310 in abeyance until the North Carolina Utilities Commission had entered a dispositive order in a pending North Carolina case between the same parties. The North Carolina Utilities Commission entered such an order long ago, and other state commissions have found that similar abeyances have expired in other states.

No abeyance was sought in Docket 08-00063, and AT&T sought to postpone a December 2008 status conference when counsel for dPi did not respond to AT&T's inquiries about whether the dPi intended to prosecute its claims in Docket 08-00063.

If dPi intends to pursue these matters, then AT&T is prepared to set a status conference and proceed on scheduling these matters at the will of the Authority. If however, dPi does not intend to pursue these matters, then AT&T respectfully suggests that the Authority should dismiss both dockets with prejudice.

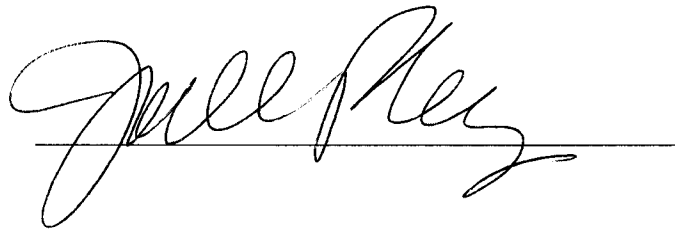
