Dear Madam or Sir:

On behalf of Knox County, Tennessee (the "County"), I write in response to the July 3, 2008, letter ("TRA Notice") from Lisa Cooper, Program Manager of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA"), concerning the above-referenced TRA docket matter.

The County responds as follows to the TRA Notice:

(A) The number of activated PEG channels for such municipality or county, as well as the number authorized to be activated, if different.

<u>County Response</u>: The County has two (2) activated PEG channels, and that is the number authorized under the County's expired franchise agreement with Comcast, the largest incumbent cable operator in the County as of January 1, 2008.

(B) The terms of any PEG support payments being provided by the incumbent service provider.

<u>County Response</u>: The County's expired franchise agreement with Comcast, the largest incumbent cable operator in the County as of January 1, 2008, does not provide for PEG support payments.
