FIFTH AMENDED CERTIFICATE OF FRANCHISE AUTHORITY

On July 7, 2009, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-301, *et seq.*, also known as the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act (the “CCVSA”), BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Tennessee (“AT&T”) filed with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (“TRA”) a *Fifth Amendment to Certificate of Franchise Authority* to supplement certain municipalities and/or unincorporated areas within counties¹ to those areas previously described within its application filed July 1, 2008 and previous amendments thereto. As no basis for denial of the amendment under Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-305(i)(1) of the CCVSA has been alleged, the TRA hereby issues the Fifth Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority to supplement the original and all previous amendments of the Certificate of Franchise Authority issued to AT&T on August 5, 2008.
