SEVENTH AMENDED CERTIFICATE OF FRANCHISE AUTHORITY

On April 28, 2010, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-301, *et seq.*, also known as the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act (the “CCVSA”), BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Tennessee (“AT&T”) filed with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (“TRA”) a *Seventh Amendment to Certificate of Franchise Authority* to supplement certain municipalities and/or unincorporated areas within counties¹ to those areas previously described within its application filed July 1, 2008 and previous amendments thereto. As no basis for denial of the amendment under Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-305(i)(1) of the CCVSA has been alleged, the TRA hereby issues the Seventh Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority to supplement the original the Certificate of Franchise Authority issued to AT&T on August 5, 2008 and all amendments issued previously thereafter.
