

FIFTEENTH AMENDED CERTIFICATE OF FRANCHISE AUTHORITY

On November 16, 2011, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-301, *et seq.*, also known as the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act ("CCVSA"), BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC, d/b/a AT&T Tennessee ("AT&T") filed with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA") a *Fifteenth Amendment to Certificate of Franchise Authority*. This amendment supplements certain municipalities and/or unincorporated areas within counties<sup>1</sup> previously described within its application filed July 1, 2008 and previous amendments thereto. As no basis for denial of the amendment under Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-305(i)(1) of the CCSVA has been alleged, the TRA hereby issues the *Fifteenth Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority* to supplement the original *Certificate of Franchise Authority* issued to AT&T on August 5, 2008 and all amendments issued previously thereafter.
