Dear Mr. Wiese:

The Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA") is in receipt of your letter dated October 22, 2010 to Larry Borum of the TRA with respect to your request for additional time to complete technical analysis and consultation regarding the above-captioned application for waiver. As indicated in your letter, the TRA sent to the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) its notification letter, received on August 26, 2010, reporting that the TRA had approved the waiver request filed by Memphis Light Gas and Water ("MLGW") and would consider the waiver effective if either approved by PHMSA or no action was taken by PHMSA in sixty (60) days. Your letter, sent prior to the expiration of the sixty days, would appear to constitute action within sixty days as contemplated in the applicable rule and in the TRA's order of August 3, 2010. As such, the TRA will not consider the waiver effective at this time but instead will await further notification from PHMSA within the next sixty days at the completion of PHMSA's analysis and consultation.

A copy of this letter is being sent to Memphis Light Gas and Water notifying it of the request for additional time to be provided to PHMSA with respect to MLGW's waiver application. We are also sending to MLGW a copy of your letter of October 22, 2010. A copy of your letter to Larry Borum and of this letter will be placed in TRA Docket No. 08-00124. Please notify the TRA as soon as practicable of PHMSA's position regarding MLGW's waiver request.



Dear Mr. Borum:

On August 26, 2010, the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) received your letter notifying us that, pending PHMSA's approval, the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (TRA) intends to grant a waiver of 49 USC 60118(a) to the Memphis Light Gas and Water (MLGW) to continue its use in operations of polyethylene pipe that has an unprotected storage period in excess of two years prior to installation.

PHMSA has until October 25, 2010, to approve or object to the waiver. PHMSA requests that the TRA extend the 60-day review period for an additional 60 days until December 23, 2010, and delay the effective date of the waiver to allow for additional technical analysis and consultation among PHMSA and the TRA staff. If the TRA does not extend the review period and delay the effective date of the waiver in order to ensure all technical and safety issues are addressed, then this letter serves as PHMSA's notice of objection to the waiver.
