JOINT APPLICATION

STi Prepaid, LLC ("STi Prepaid") and Sprint Communications Company, L.P. ("Sprint") (the "Applicants"), through their undersigned counsel and pursuant to TCA § 65-4-112, hereby request approval from the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("Authority" or "TRA") to transfer certain Sprint assets (excluding Sprint's authority to provide intrastate telecommunications services in Tennessee) to STi Prepaid.

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE TRANSACTION AND THE ASSET PURCHASE AGREEMENT

On April 7, 2008, Sprint and certain of its affiliates (collectively, "Sellers") entered into an Asset Purchase Agreement ("Agreement") with STi Prepaid pursuant to which Sellers agreed to transfer certain assets to STi Prepaid (the "Transaction"). Specifically, Sellers agreed to transfer all of their assets related to the provision of prepaid calling card services, including tangible prepaid card inventory, customer agreements and contracts, vendor agreements and contracts, prepaid card point-of-sale and promotional materials, and rights to host personal identification numbers ("PINs") used to make prepaid calling card calls ("Assets").

The Transaction will not result in any change of control or ownership in either Sprint or STi Prepaid. Both carriers will continue to offer intrastate telecommunications services in Tennessee pursuant to their respective issued authorizations. Once the Transaction is consummated, any prepaid calling cards remaining in the market that list Sprint as the provider

of the prepaid calling card service will continue to be available for use by consumers. STi Prepaid will continue to provide the underlying telecommunications services associated with any prepaid calling cards previously served by Sprint. Sprint will not remove its prepaid service from its Tennessee state tariff for at least twelve (12) months following the closing date of the Transaction.¹

II. DESCRIPTION OF THE APPLICANTS

A. STi Prepaid, LLC

STi Prepaid is a Delaware limited liability company with its headquarters at 1250 Broadway, 26th Floor, New York, NY 10001. STi Prepaid holds authority to provide resold intrastate interexchange services within the State of Tennessee, which authorization was granted in TRA Docket No.07-00191 (Company ID 129029). STi Prepaid currently offers prepaid calling card and dial-around (10-10) services in Tennessee and throughout the United States.

B. Sprint Communications Company, L.P.

Sprint is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Sprint Nextel Corporation existing under the laws of the State of Delaware with headquarters at 6200 Sprint Parkway, Overland Park, Kansas 66251. Sprint is duly authorized by the Authority to provide competitive local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services to end users throughout the State of Tennessee.

Sprint's rates, terms and conditions will continue pursuant to its tariff until the later of (1) twelve months after the closing date of the transaction or (2) the twelve month anniversary of the date the retailer from which the prepaid card was sold is transitioned from Sprint-marked cards to STi Prepaid marked cards. Any consumers holding Sprint prepaid cards previously issued will continue to receive service without interruption and without an increase in rates, or changes in terms or conditions. STi Prepaid will not charge a higher rate than what is displayed on the Sprint prepaid card, but may reduce the rate.

IV. THE TRANSACTION IS IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST

The proposed Transaction furthers the public interest, convenience, and necessity. STi Prepaid is a major prepaid card provider offering state-of-the-art services to its customers. Thus, consumers currently utilizing Sprint prepaid cards will be able to enjoy the high quality and array of features that STi Prepaid's own customers now enjoy. Further, as an affiliate of Leucadia National Corporation, a publicly traded company, STi Prepaid will have access to the public capital markets that can provide support for the expansion of the prepaid calling card services currently offered by Sprint.

In addition, the Transaction will not impact consumers currently utilizing Sprint's prepaid calling cards. Any consumers holding prepaid calling cards previously issued by Sprint will

continue to receive high-quality telecommunications services without interruption and without change in rates, terms, or conditions.

V. REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF RULE 1220-4-2-.56(2)(d)(2)

Authority Rule 1220-4-2-.56(2)(d)(2) requires that, generally, prior to the transfer of a customer base, the affected customers will be provided with notice of the change in long distance providers not less thirty (30) days prior to the actual customer transfer. Pursuant to said Rule, "For good cause shown," the Authority may waive this requirement. To the extent this Rule may apply to the instant Transaction, the Authority should waive the Rule in this instance because the customer base being transferred is not a presubscribed interexchange carrier customer base as contemplated in Rule 1220-4-2-.56 and the identities and addresses of the customer base are unknown to Sprint and STi Prepaid. Sprint's prepaid calling card services can be used by any person at any time. Sprint has no knowledge of the identity of the persons that utilize its prepaid calling card services, and has no relationship with the person utilizing the prepaid calling card. Accordingly, customer notification of this Transaction is unnecessary and would be impossible as a practical matter.³

As a resource for consumers, however, Sprint intends to post a notice on its website informing consumers who have purchased a Sprint-branded card that STi Prepaid is now the provider of service, but that Sprint's domestic (intrastate and interstate) prepaid card rates will remain in effect for a period of at least twelve (12) months. Consumers will also be informed that they should dial the toll free customer service number on their cards to obtain information on international prepaid card rates. A user of a Sprint-branded card that calls the toll-free access number and enters the PIN to make a prepaid call will be informed that STi Prepaid and not

Sprint is now the service provider. When a consumer calls for customer service associated with a Sprint-branded card, STi Prepaid's customer service representatives will also explain to cardholders that the prepaid calling card service is now being provided by STi Prepaid rather than Sprint.

VI. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, the Joint Applicants submit that approval of the transfer of the Sprint Assets to STi Prepaid pursuant to the Agreement is in the public interest. Accordingly, the Applicants respectfully request approval of this Joint Application.

- (2) The export of telecommunications services and related payments to countries that are subject to economic sanctions may be restricted. For information concerning current restrictions, call the Office of Foreign Assets Control, U.S. Department of the Treasury, (202) 622-2520.
- (3) Carriers shall comply with the requirements of Section 63.11 of the Commission's rules, which requires notification by, and in certain circumstances prior notification by, U.S. carriers acquiring an affiliation with foreign carriers. - (8) Carriers regulated as dominant for the provision of a particular communications service on a particular route for any reason other than a foreign carrier affiliation under Section 63.10 of the rules shall file tariffs pursuant to Section 203 of the Communications Act, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 203, and Part 61 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. Part 61. Carriers shall not otherwise file tariffs except as permitted by Section 61.19 of the rules, 47 C.F.R. § 61.19. Except as specified in Section 20.15 with respect to commercial mobile radio service providers, carriers regulated as non-dominant, as defined in Section 61.3, and providing detariffed international services pursuant to Section 61.19, must comply with all applicable public disclosure and maintenance of information requirements in Sections 42.10 and 42.11.
