

German officials didn't have further details, but in principle, border checks allow officials to turn back anyone lacking valid papers to enter.

The move, de Maiziere said, was also "a signal to Europe: Germany is facing up to its humanitarian responsibility, but the burdens connected with the large number of refugees must be distributed in solidarity within Europe."

Kingsport Power Company, d/b/a AEP Appalachian ower ("Kingsport"), hereby gives notice that on September 2015 it made a tariff filing with the Tennessee Regulatory uthority ("TRA") relative to changes in Kingsport's Purchased ower Adjustment Rider ("PPAR") surcharges which will sult in a 2.00% increase in electric rates. The PPAR uthorizes Kingsport, upon no less than 30-days notice, to oply a surcharge to all customer bills rendered by it to allow ir changes in the non-fuel cost of purchased power from ingsport's wholesale power supplier, under rate schedules plemented by the Fecleral Energy Regulatory Commission FERC"). Changes in fuel costs associated with power from ingsport's wholesale supplier would continue to be reflected Kingsport's fuel adjustment clause. Kingsport's current tars, and its filing regarding changes to its PPAR surcharges, re on file with the TRA at 502 Deaderick Street, Nashville, ennessee, and are available for public inspection.

Pursuant to Revised Rate Schedule 23, Kingsport incurring increased purchased power costs related to ansmission. In its September 8, 2015 tariff filing with the RA, Kingsport provided new PPAR surcharges, calculated accordance with the provisions of its PPAR, to reflect such creased costs. The surcharges, to be applied to customer lls beginning 30 days from the date of this publication, ould result in about a 2.00% increase for Kingsport resignitial customers and large general service and industrial astomers.

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
