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**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF CCN TO PROVIDE  
TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICES**


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This matter came before Chairman David F. Jones, Vice Chairman John Hie, Commissioner Herbert H. Hilliard, Commissioner Kenneth C. Hill, and Commissioner David Crowell of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the “Commission” or “TPUC”), the voting panel assigned to this docket, during a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on August 18, 2025.<sup>1</sup> On April 27, 2009, the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, now TPUC, issued an order granting Long Distance Consolidated Billing Co. (“LDCB” or “Company”) a CCN to provide operator services and/or resell local telecommunications services.<sup>2</sup> On July 9, 2025, the Commission received a request from the Company to cancel its CCN because it has neither active operations nor customers in Tennessee. The Company is in good standing with the Commission concerning payment of mandatory inspection fees. Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the Commissioners voted unanimously to grant the Company’s request to cancel its CCN.
