Dear Ms. Standley:

In response to your request for information dated April 24, 2009, DukeNet Communications, LLC (DukeNet) respectfully submits the following information:

- 1. Q: What is the legal name of the company? The Secretary of State certification included with the application was for DukeNet Communication Services, LLC.
 - A: The legal name of the company is DukeNet Communications, LLC. DukeNet Communication Services, LLC is a sister company also authorized to conduct business in Tennessee. DukeNet Communication Services, LLC's Secretary of State certification was submitted with DukeNet's application in error. The true and correct Secretary of State certification for DukeNet Communications, LLC is attached hereto as Attachment A, and we respectfully request that it be considered as part of DukeNet's application and the DukeNet Communication Services, LLC certification be disregarded for purposes of this docket.
- 2. Q: The application states that the Exhibit E is DukeNet Communications, LLC's "local exchange tariff...describing the terms and conditions under which it will offer local exchange telecommunications services in Tennessee." However, Exhibit E contains a tariff titled "DukeNet Communications, LLC Regulations

CHARLESTON, SC CHARLOTTE, NC COLUMBIA, SC MYRTLE BEACH, SC SPARTANBURG, SC

- and Schedule of Charges Applying to Interexchange Telecommunications Services within the State of Tennessee." Will DukeNet Communications, LLC be providing local exchange services in Tennessee? If so, provide an informational tariff for the local exchange services to be offered.
- A: The illustrative tariff attached to the application as Exhibit E is intended to be an Interexchange Telecommunications Services Tariff and accurately sets forth the services DukeNet intends to offer in Tennessee. As described in the answer to question number three, DukeNet will not be providing basic local exchange services in Tennessee.
- 3. Q: The description of services DukeNet plans to offer provided on page 4 of the application appears to contradict the statement on page 6 of the application that reads, "DukeNet does not plan to provide voice grade services in Tennessee." Does DukeNet plan to offer local telecommunications services? If so, provide a Toll Dialing Parity Plan.
 - A: DukeNet does not plan to provide voice grade service or otherwise offer services to end users but rather will be a "carrier's carrier" installing fiber to be leased by other carriers providing services to end users.
- 4. **Q:** What is DukeNet's expected demand for NXXs per NPA within a year of approval of your application?
 - **A:** For the reasons set forth in the answer to question number three, DukeNet does not expect to have any demand for NXXs.
- 5. Q: Will DukeNet provide access to 911 and E911 services, white page directory listings and directory assistance, access to and support for the Tennessee Relay Center in the same manner as incumbent local exchange telephone companies, free blocking for 900/976 type services in accordance with Authority policy, LifeLine and Link-Up services to qualifying citizens of Tennessee and educational discounts in existence as of June 6, 1995 in accordance with TRA Rule 1220-4-8-.04?
 - A: For the reasons set forth in the answer to question number three, principally that DukeNet does not intend to provide basic local exchange service in Tennessee, DukeNet will not be in a position to provide access to 911 and E911 services, white page directory listing and directory assistance, access to and support for the Tennessee Relay Center in the same manner as incumbent local exchange telephone companies, free blocking for 900/976 type services, LifeLine and Link-Up services and educational discounts in existence as of June 6, 1995
- **6. Q:** Provide a sample bill.

- A: DukeNet is engaged in the business of leasing fiber to carriers and therefore does not have a sample retail customer bill to offer.
- 7. Q: For what reason did DukeNet cancel its certification in the state of Florida in 2006 and then get recertified in 2007?
 - A: DukeNet was originally certificated in Florida in anticipation of a business opportunity. When that business opportunity did not materialize, DukeNet canceled its certification in Florida. Shortly thereafter, a new and unanticipated business opportunity was presented in Florida, and DukeNet was re-certificated in 2007 in order to pursue the new opportunity.
- 8. Q: Provide the educational background for Mr. Cockerham and Mr. Lane and more detailed information regarding previous telecommunications experience including positions held, dates and duties and responsibilities for each prior position. Detail the day-to-day duties and responsibilities of each officer for the company's Tennessee operations.
 - A: Please find the updated information for Mr. Cockerham and Mr. Lane attached hereto as **Attachment B**.
- 9. Q: DukeNet provided the financial information for its parent company, Duke Energy Corp. Does DukeNet Communications, LLC have its own financials? If so, provide the most recent Balance Sheet, Income Statement and Statement of Cash Flows. If the company does not have financial information, provide a statement from an authorized representative of Duke Energy Corp. agreeing to provide financial resources for DukeNet Communications, LLC's Tennessee operations.
 - A: Enclosed as <u>Attachment C</u>, please find a statement issued by Stephen G. De May, Senior Vice President and Treasurer of Duke Energy, Corp., agreeing to provide financial resources for DukeNet Communications, LLC's Tennessee operations when necessary.
- 10. Q: Provide a sworn statement from an officer of DukeNet Communications, LLC that the company will adhere to all applicable state and federal laws and TRA rules.
 - A: Attached hereto as <u>Attachment D</u>, please find a sworn statement of Tony Cockerham, Vice President of Sales and Customer Operations for DukeNet, acknowledging DukeNet's intent to adhere to all applicable state and federal laws and TRA rules.
- 11. Q: Provide a bond or letter of credit in compliance with Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-125(j).

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- A: Attached hereto as <u>Attachment E</u>, please find a corporate surety bond in the amount of \$20,000.
- 12. Q: How will the company comply with Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-21-114, which requires toll-free calling within each county in Tennessee?
 - A: DukeNet will not bill for countywide calls within Tennessee because DukeNet will not be providing or billing for services to end users.




