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**ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF FOR NINETY DAYS,  
APPOINTING A HEARING OFFICER AND APPROVING WAIVER**

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This matter came before Chairman Eddie Roberson, Director Sara Kyle and Director Mary W. Freeman of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the “Authority” or “TRA”), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on May 18, 2009 for consideration of the Petition of Kentucky Utilities Company to change and increase rates and charges filed on May 1, 2009 requesting approval of a revised tariff with an effective date of June 1, 2009. The Petition further requested that the Authority waive the filing requirements of TRA Rule 1220-1-1-.03(4).<sup>1</sup>


During the Authority Conference, the panel voted unanimously to suspend the proposed tariff for ninety days, from June 1, 2009 to August 29, 2009, and to appoint the Authority’s General Counsel or his designee to serve as Hearing Officer for the purpose of hearing preliminary matters, including entering a protective order and ruling on petitions to intervene, setting a procedural schedule to completion and preparing the matter for a hearing before the

panel. Further, pursuant to TRA Rule 1220-1-1-.05,<sup>2</sup> the panel voted unanimously to waive the requirements of TRA Rule 1220-1-1-.03(4), finding that one electronic version of documents in this proceeding is sufficient.
