Sprint Communications understands that formal application to the Commission is not required to surrender its certificates in Tennessee.

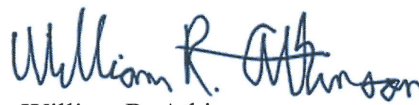
The Commission originally granted the predecessor-in-interest to Sprint Communications, GTE Sprint Communications Corporation, a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity in Docket No. U-84-7326 on September 25, 1985.

In accordance with 47 C.F.R. Sec. 63.71, Sprint Communications has obtained the required approvals to discontinue service and no longer has customers receiving any services requiring a certificate. Accordingly, there are no customers to be notified regarding this request, and cancellation of Sprint Communications’ certificate will have no adverse consequences for consumers in Tennessee.
