Dear Ms. Dillon:

Frontier Communications of America, Inc. ("Frontier") respectfully files this letter as an amendment of and clarification to its Petition in Docket No. 10-00100.

As a correction to paragraph 8 of Frontier's Petition, Frontier does not require a new Local Routing Number in connection with its proposed new service. Frontier only requires a clean thousand block in each of the four rate centers. The thousand blocks will be used in Frontier's Internet Protocol soft switch to set up the Voice over Internet Protocol component of the new service, which Frontier will provide to its customers on a facilities basis. Once the VoIP component is set up, Frontier will port the thousand blocks to an underlying cellular carrier to provide the cellular component of the service. Because the numbers must be active in Frontier's soft switch for the VoIP service to work, it is not possible to implement this new service through the use of number resources obtained and used directly by the underlying cellular carrier. Frontier will brand the entire service as a Frontier service, and Frontier will bill its end user customers for both the VoIP and cellular components of the service.

Frontier would like to express its appreciation to Mr. Lewis DeBoard of the Authority's Staff for his helpful and clarifying questions to ensure that this proceeding was not a wasted effort.
