PETITION TO INTERVENE

Robert E. Cooper, Jr., Attorney General and Reporter for the State of Tennessee, by and through the Consumer Advocate and Protection Division of the Office of the Attorney General ("Consumer Advocate"), pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-118, respectfully petitions the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA" or "Authority") to grant the Consumer Advocate's intervention into this proceeding on behalf of the public interest, because consumers may be adversely affected by Tennessee American Water Company's ("TAWC") Petition of Tennessee American Water Company to Change and Increase Certain Rates and Charges So as to Permit It to Earn a Fair and Adequate Rate of Return on its Property Used and Useful in Furnishing Water Service to Its Customers, TRA Docket 10-00189. For cause, Petitioner would show as follows:

1. The Consumer Advocate is authorized by Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-118 to represent the interests of Tennessee consumers of public utilities services by initiating and intervening as a party in proceedings before the Authority in accordance with the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act and Authority rules.

2. TAWC is a public utility regulated by the Authority and provides water services

to consumers located in the State of Tennessee.

3. On September 17, 2010, TAWC filed in the Authority a Petition of Tennessee

American Water Company to Change and Increase Certain Rates and Charges So as to Permit It

to Earn a Fair and Adequate Rate of Return on its Property Used and Useful in Furnishing

Water Service to Its Customers, requesting an upward adjustment of \$9,984,463, or 27.66%, in

the rates it charges to customers with a proposed effective date of October 17, 2010. Approval

of such an increase may result in harm to consumers.

4. Additional investigation and discovery may be needed to determine whether the

proposed rate increase and charges sought by TAWC are appropriate and effective.

5. Only by participating in this proceeding can the Consumer Advocate work

adequately to protect the interests of consumers.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully asks the Authority to grant the Petition to

Intervene.
