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**ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF FOR SIXTY DAYS,  
CONVENING A CONTESTED CASE AND APPOINTING A HEARING OFFICER**

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This matter came before Director Eddie Roberson, Director Kenneth C. Hill and Director Sara Kyle of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority" or "TRA"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on December 13, 2010 for consideration of *Kentucky Utilities Company's Petition for Authority to Adjust Rates* ("Petition") filed on December 1, 2010. The tariff accompanying the *Petition* has an effective date of January 1, 2011.


During the Authority Conference, the panel voted unanimously to suspend the proposed tariff for sixty days, from January 1, 2011 to March 1, 2011, to convene a contested case proceeding and to appoint the Authority's General Counsel or his designee to act as Hearing Officer for the purpose of preparing the matter for a hearing before the panel, including but not limited to, entering a protective order, ruling on petitions to intervene and setting a procedural schedule to completion. The panel further voted, pursuant to TRA Rule 1220-1-1-.05 and for good cause shown, (1) to waive the requirement of TRA Rule 1220-1-1-.03(4)<sup>1</sup> and found that one electronic version of documents in

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
<sup>1</sup> TRA Rule 1220-1-1-.03(4) requires that a written original and four written copies of all electronic documents or an unbound, one sided original and thirteen copies of all written documents be filed with the Authority.

this proceeding is sufficient; and (2) to waive TRA Rules 1220-4-1-.05(1)(a) and (b)<sup>2</sup> and approved Kentucky Utilities Company's request to provide a summary of the proposed changes at its Middlesboro, Kentucky, business office and to send individual letters to its four customers in Tennessee.


