New TVA smart phone app provides lake information

The Tennessee Valley Authority announced the release of a TVA application for smart phones (<http://itunes.apple.com/app/tva-lake-info/id446033154?mt=8>) that will provide real time information about TVA lakes.

The app, initially available to iPhone users, offers lake elevations, water release schedules, yearly operating guides and Google-based maps. Available for free at the

iPhone App Store, the app gives lake enthusiasts access to TVA reservoir information from anywhere using Wi-Fi or the user's cellular network.

The app will also work on the iPod Touch and the iPad. "One of the most popular destinations on TVA's website is the lake information page," said John McCormick, senior vice president of River Operations. "Now, all of that information can be

accessed right on your smart phone."

Features of the TVA iPhone app include: Lake elevations - water levels information for all TVA lakes

Water release schedule - when TVA releases water through power generating turbines or spillway gates

Lake operating guide - yearly guide TVA uses to manage water levels

Navigation lock information - contact information

and instructions for using the navigation locks

Navigation markers reference guide - explains channel markers and navigation aids

Google-based maps - locations of lakes in the Tennessee River system

Rec trails grant workshop scheduled

The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation is beginning the 2011 Recreational Trails Program grant application cycle with an August 24 workshop to help government officials, parks and recreation departments and non-profit organizations understand the grant application process.

Recreational Trails Program grants may be used for non-routine maintenance and restoration of existing trails, development and rehabilitation, trailhead or trailhead facilities such as restrooms, kiosks and parking lots, construction of new trails and land acquisition for recreational trails or corridors. Federal, state and local government agencies may apply, as well as non-profit organizations that have obtained IRS 501(c)(3) status and have a written trail management agreement with the agency that owns the property where the trail project is located.

The department's Division of Recreation Educational Services will host three workshops on Aug. 24, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. (local times apply) at the following locations:

Funding for RTP grants is provided by the Federal Highway Administration through the federal Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act. The Department of Environment and Conservation administers this grant program for the state of Tennessee.

The application deadline for the 2011-2012 Recreational Trails Programs grant cycle is Oct. 28 at 4 p.m. (CST). The RTP grant is an 80/20 percent match and the total grant amount awarded this year will be \$120,000.

NOTICE OF HEARING ON NAVITAS TN NG, LLC'S PETITION FOR EMERGENCY RELIEF FOR NATURAL GAS RATES

Navitas TN NG, LLC has filed a Petition for Emergency Relief with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority") in Docket No. 11-00060 requesting immediate adjustment of natural gas rates. Since acquiring control of the gas utility systems of Gasco Distributions Systems, Inc. in Jellico, Campbell County, Byrdstown, Pickett County, and Fentress County, Tennessee and Whitley County, Kentucky, the system has continued to operate at a substantial loss. At the time of the acquisition by Navitas of Gasco, Gasco operated as a Debtor in Possession while in proceedings before the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Ohio. Navitas adopted all of Gasco's existing tariffs in which an adjustment is overdue. To ensure safe and reliable gas service prior to filing a formal rate case with the Authority, Navitas is requesting the Authority's approval to implement a temporary monthly customer charge of \$6.00 and surcharge of \$0.25 per 9 Ccf per month in addition to the current tariff. The relief sought is estimated to reduce the operating losses of Navitas until a formal rate adjustment is approved. Its customers, regardless of where they are located on the system, will experience an increase in their gas costs of \$6.00 to \$8.25 per month depending on usage.

The Petition for Emergency Relief has been set for hearing before the Authority at August 1 2011 at 1:00 p.m. (CST) in the Hearing Room on the Ground Floor of the Offices of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority at 460 James Robertson Parkway, Nashville Tennessee.



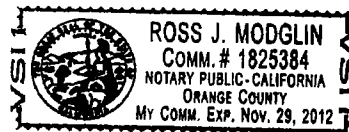

**NOTICE OF HEARING ON
NAVITAS TN NG, LLC'S
PETITION FOR EMERGENCY RELIEF FOR NATURAL GAS RATES**

Navitas TN NG, LLC has filed a Petition for Emergency Relief with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority") in Docket No. 11-00060 requesting immediate adjustment of natural gas rates. Since acquiring control of the gas utility systems of Gasco Distributions Systems, Inc. in Jellico, Campbell County, Byrdstown, Pickett County, and Fentress County, Tennessee and Whitley County, Kentucky, the system has continued to operate at a substantial loss. At the time of the acquisition by Navitas of Gasco, Gasco operated as a Debtor in Possession while in proceedings before the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Ohio. Navitas adopted all of Gasco's existing tariffs in which an adjustment is overdue. To ensure safe and reliable gas service prior to filing a formal rate case with the Authority, Navitas is requesting the Authority's approval to implement a temporary monthly customer charge of \$6.00 and surcharge of \$0.25 per 9 Ccf per month in addition to the current tariff. The relief sought is estimated to reduce the operating losses of Navitas until a formal rate adjustment is approved. Its customers, regardless of where they are located on the system, will experience an increase in their gas costs of \$6.00 to \$8.25 per month depending on usage.

The Petition for Emergency Relief has been set for hearing before the Authority at August 1 2011 at 1:00 p.m. (CST) in the Hearing Room on the Ground Floor of the Offices of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority at 460 James Robertson Parkway, Nashville Tennessee.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that all interested persons may appear at the Hearing and be heard, and that after the Hearing on emergency rate relief, the TRA, regardless of the relief requested in the Petition for Emergency Relief shall issue such Orders and grant such relief as it deems to be proper, necessary, fair, reasonable and equitable in the premises, whether or not specifically prayed for in the Petition for Emergency Relief.
