Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. §65-4-118(b)(2), the Consumer Advocate and Protection Division of the Attorney General's Office ("Consumer Advocate") respectfully requests information from the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("Authority" or "TRA") concerning Berry's Chapel Utility, Inc. ("BCUI" or "Company").

Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-118(b)(2) provides as follows:

(2) If the consumer advocate division concludes that it is without sufficient information to initiate a proceeding, it may petition the authority, after notice to the affected utility, to obtain information from the utility. The petition shall state with particularity the information sought and the type of proceeding that may be initiated if the information is obtained. Additionally, the consumer advocate division may request information from the authority staff, and, if the authority staff is in possession of the requested information, such information shall be provided within ten (10) days of the request.

Information Request

1. Any letters, emails or other communications to anyone at the TRA including but not limited to TRA Directors, the Executive Director, TRA advisory staff, or TRA Party Staff concerning TRA Docket No. 11-00065 or the issues raised in this Docket, (e.g., odor control, refunds, improper charges, improper collection activities, flood damage, the proposed Settlement Agreement, attorney's fees, or the role of the Consumer Advocate in representing consumers, etc.) from **July, 2010**, the date of what the Consumer Advocate contends was the first improper charge by Lynwood/Berry's Chapel at issue in the present Docket.
