SEVENTH AMENDED CERTIFICATE OF FRANCHISE AUTHORITY

On August 10, 2020, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-301, *et seq.*, also known as the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act (“CCVSA”), TDS Telecom Service Corporation (“TDS”) filed with the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“TPUC”) a *Seventh Amendment to Certificate of Franchise Authority*. In its Seventh Amendment, TDS supplements certain municipalities and unincorporated areas within counties<sup>1</sup> previously described within its application filed August 5, 2011, and previous amendments thereto. Upon such filing, the Tennessee Public Utility Commission hereby issues the *Seventh Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority*.
