### PETITION OF TCG MIDSOUTH INC FOR REVIEW OF CENTRAL OFFICE CODE DENIAL

TCG Midsouth, Inc. ("TCG"), pursuant to rules adopted by the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") for challenging the decision of the Number Pooling Administrator ("NeuStar"), hereby petitions the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA") to a review NeuStar's denial of TCG's application for an NPA-NXX-X in the Gallatin rate center in order for TCG to serve its customer.

- 1. TCG is a competitive local exchange carrier providing telecommunications services in Tennessee under the jurisdiction of the TRA.
- 2. NeuStar is an independent, non-governmental entity responsible for administering and managing numbering resources. *See* C.F.R. Section 52.13(a) and (b).
- 3. This petition is based on the FCC Rules found at 47 C.F.R. § 52.15(g)(3)(iv) and pursuant to the Thousands-Block Number (NXX-X) Pooling Administration Guidelines ("TBPAG") and the Central Office Code (NXX) Assignment Guidelines published by the Industry Numbering Committee ("INC"). On March 31, 2000, the FCC issued a *Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rule Making* related to numbering resource optimization ("FCC 00-104" or the "March Order"). On December 29, 2000, the FCC issued a *Second Report and Order, on*

Gallatin Rate Center

Reconsideration in CC Docket No. 96-98 and CC Docket No. 99-200, and Second Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in CC Docket No. 99-200 ("FCC 00-249" or the "December Order"). The Orders addressed issues and strategies relating to the efficient use of numbering.

- 4. In FCC 00-104 and FCC 00-429, the FCC announced rules and sought comments to implement uniform standards for numbering resources, to increase efficiency in the use of existing telephone numbers and to slow further exhaustion of the North American Numbering Plan.
- 5. FCC 00-104 adopted a revised standard for assessing a carrier's need for numbering resources by requiring carriers to report rate center based utilization to NeuStar. The FCC further required that, to qualify for new numbering resources, applicants must prove that their existing inventory in the said rate center will exhaust within six months of the application.
- 6. In addition to the months-to-exhaust ("MTE") threshold, the FCC also requires carriers to show rate center utilization of 75% to receive the additional numbering resources in said rate center.<sup>1</sup> Based on the FCC's orders, carriers must meet both the six-month MTE requirement and the utilization threshold on a rate center basis to obtain additional number resources.<sup>2</sup>
- 7. A TCG customer, Rich Products Corporation ("Rich Products"), has requested 50 numbers, NOT in a 0, 1, 8 or 9 block in the Gallatin rate center. Rich Products needs these numbers for additional growth at this site. In addition, Rich Products has requested numbers in a block other than a 9-block to avoid calls dialed in error to emergency 9-1-1 service. Numbers in the 9-block currently used by Rich Products will be returned for general use. A copy of the

letter outlining the request is attached as Exhibit A. TCG has developed a plan that the customer will implement so that all 50 numbers will be assigned and activated within 180 days.

- 8. The Gallatin rate center of the 615 Area Code converted to Number Pooling on March 14, 2002. Consequently, normal numbering resource acquisition by a Number Pooling carrier is gained through an interface with NeuStar<sup>3</sup>. According to NeuStar, based on the 2011-1 NRUF and NPA Exhaust Analysis dated April 2011, the projected exhaust date of the 615 NPA is the Third Quarter of 2015. Therefore, granting TCG's request for numbering resources would not materially impact the exhaustion of available numbers in the 615 NPA.
- 9. On August 17, 2011, TCG submitted a "Thousand Block Application Form Part 1A", and a "Months to Exhaust and Utilization Certification Worksheet TN Level" to NeuStar for a thousand-block in the Gallatin rate center to satisfy the customer request. A copy of this application is attached as Exhibit B.
- 10. During the session via the Pooling Administration System ("PAS"), TCG received an error message instructing to "Return to the Months To Exhaust Form", the request would not process through the system without a state waiver. The error message is included in Exhibit B. NeuStar applies the FCC rules and INC Guidelines. Per Paragraphs 5 and 6, the rules require that a block holder requesting growth resources demonstrate that existing resources within the rate center will both exhaust within 6 months and meet the 75% utilization level. The error message indicated that neither threshold was met.
- 11. Although TCG has adequate telephone numbers to satisfy incremental requests for numbers without receiving a new block of numbers, TCG's existing resources cannot satisfy this

customer's specific need. TCG holds only the 9 block in this rate center which does not conform to the customer's requirements.

- 12. As a result of the denial for additional numbering resources, TCG is unable to provide the telecommunications services requested by its customer.
- 13. In setting its policy for the assignment of telephone numbers, the FCC designated NANPA and NeuStar, as the Pooling Administrator, to handle numbering resource administration.<sup>4</sup> If a numbering resource administrator withholds numbering resources from a carrier, the FCC has specifically authorized state commissions to overturn those decisions for reasonable cause. That authority is specifically set out in the relevant FCC Rule, 47 C.F.R. §52.15 (g)(3)(iv), which states:

The NANPA shall withhold numbering resources from any U.S. carrier that fails to comply with the reporting and numbering resource application requirements established in this part. The NANPA shall not issue numbering resources to a carrier without an OCN. The NANPA must notify the carrier in writing of its decision to withhold numbering resources within ten (10) days of receiving a request for numbering resources. The carrier may challenge the NANPA's decision to the appropriate state regulatory commission. The state commission may affirm, or may overturn, the NANPA's decision to withhold numbering resources from the carrier based on its determination of compliance with the reporting and numbering resource application requirements herein.

The FCC also clarified in the FCC 00-249 Order that carriers may appeal to states using a "safety valve" mechanism.<sup>5</sup> The FCC contemplated the need for, and gave structure to states to

respond when denials failed to consider a "specific customer request".

14. An essential aspect of the "safety valve" provision is the accelerated response that is provided for in the FCC's order: States should act upon such a request in most instances in 10 business days, as noted by the FCC.

Finally, we recognize that in many instances, the failure to address a request for additional numbering resources can impair a carrier's ability to stay in or expand business. We therefore direct states to act on carrier requests for a safety valve as expeditiously as possible. Although we do not establish a specific time limit for states to act on these requests, we believe that, in most instances, 10 business days from receipt of a request that the state determines to be sufficiently detailed and complete will be sufficient time to review and act upon safety valve requests. If a state does not reach a decision on a safety valve request within a reasonable timeframe, carriers may submit such requests to the Commission for resolution. In addition, carriers may appeal to the Commission safety valve decisions made by states, and we delegate authority to the Common Carrier Bureau to review such petitions as expeditiously as possible.<sup>6</sup>

- 15. TCG seeks the Authority's review of NeuStar's decision to withhold resources from it on the grounds that it: (1) violates the orders and rules of the FCC which grant carriers access to numbering resources to meet specific customer demands upon a sufficient showing of need and (2) interferes with TCG's ability to serve its customer. As the FCC has stated, "Under no circumstances should consumers be precluded from receiving telecommunications services of their choice from providers of their choice for want of numbering resources." By refusing to grant numbering resources to meet this customer's needs, the decision is prevents the customer from obtaining the service of its choice from its carrier of choice, TCG.
  - 16. During the Authority Conference on September 12, 2011, Docket 11-00133, Mr

Brent Struthers with NeuStar, representing both the North American Numbering Plan Administrator and the Pooling Administrator, made the following statement:

For the record, I would like to state for this and all future safety valve requests that neither the North American Numbering Plan Administrator nor the Pooling Administrator objects or has any position on any safety valve requests ad infinitum, ad nauseam, etc., etc.

17. Included with this Petition is a draft approval order for the Authority's consideration.

#### **Relief Sought**

For these reasons, TCG respectfully requests the TRA expeditiously review NeuStar's decision denying TCG's request for additional numbering resources and order NeuStar to provide the requested numbers to meet the specific requirements of TCG's Gallatin customer.

Rich Products has additional growth at this site which requires an additional 50 DID numbers. Current numbers in the 9000 range that were provided by AT&T LNS are causing end user errors with callers dialing 911 by mistake which is another reason for new number request. PBX equipment cannot handle the 0000, 1000, or 8000 ranges; these ranges won't work with equipment.
