WITHDRAWAL OF REQUEST FOR CANCELLATION FOR NONCOMPLIANCE

Comes now the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“TPUC” or “Commission”) Staff acting as a Party (“Party Staff”) by and through counsel and withdraws its request that the Commission enter an order canceling the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (“CCN”) issued to REVTEL, LLC (“REVTEL” or “Company”) for noncompliance with statutory requirements. In support of its withdrawal, Party Staff would state as follows:

Subsequent to the filing of the Request for Cancellation for Noncompliance (“Request”), a Company representative contacted Party Staff to make arrangements to comply with statutory requirements concerning submission of annual revenue reports, payment of annual inspection fees, and the annual update to its small and minority-owned telecommunications business participation plan (“SMTB Plan”). Commission Staff notified REVTEL via email on May 21, 2024 that the delinquent annual revenue reports had been received along with checks for the delinquent annual inspection fees and late charges. The checks have been processed and deposited bringing the REVTEL into a compliant status with regard to annual revenue reports and annual inspection fees.

In addition, the Company submitted an annual update to its SMTB Plan. REVTEL is therefore, compliant with SMTB Plan requirements for 2024.

Finally, through this process, the Party Staff has learned that REVTEL, LLC has changed its name with the Secretary of State to RevTel Communiccations, LLC. Commission. Party Staff has advised the Company of the statutory requirement to submit a Petition to advise the Commission of the name change. The Company advised that it will submit a name change petition as soon as practicable.

As set forth hereinabove, REVTEL is now compliant with the statutory requirements for which Party Staff sought cancellation, making the Request moot. Therefore, Party Staff requests that the Administrative Judge enter an order approving the withdrawal of the Request and closing this docket.
