**ORDER APPROVING PETITION FOR EXPEDITED REVIEW OF
CENTRAL OFFICE CODE DENIAL**

This matter came before the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority") at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on February 27, 2012 for consideration of the *Petition for Expedited Review of Central Office Code Denial* filed by Tennessee Telephone Exchange, Inc. ("Tennessee Telephone" or "Company") on February 1, 2012.

On or about December 22, 2011, Tennessee Telephone submitted an application to the Number Pooling Administrator ("Neustar") for the purpose of obtaining a Local Routing Number ("LRN")¹. Specifically, Tennessee Telephone requested one (1) NPA-NXX, in the rate center, for the purpose of assigning one ten digit number to its new switch as an LRN. NPA-NXX assignment guidelines for LRN purposes require the same utilization and projected exhaust criteria as all other numbering resources requests. Therefore, the guidelines permit the assignment of additional codes only after a carrier demonstrates that a rate center has a 75% utilization rate and that its estimated exhaust date does not exceed six months.² Because the Rate Center's utilization rate is currently approximately 61% utilization rate and the estimated exhaustion date is approximately 66 months, Neustar denied the application by Tennessee Telephone.

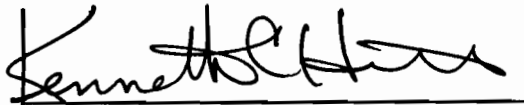

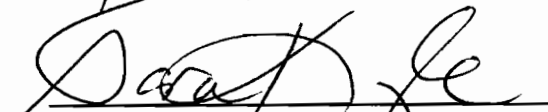

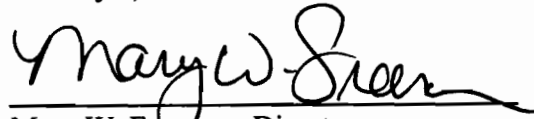
The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") has authorized the Authority to review the Pooling Administrator's denial of a numbering application.³ Specifically, the FCC has stated that a state commission may review the Pooling Administrator decision to deny a request for numbering resources.⁴ After consideration of the facts contained in the record, the public interest, and this agency's responsibility to foster competition in the telecommunications industry,⁵ the Directors voted unanimously to approve the request of Tennessee Telephone and reverse the Pooling Administrator's denial of Tennessee Telephone's request for additional numbering resources in the Rate Center.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. Neustar's decision to deny Tennessee Telephone's request for additional numbering resources is reversed as stated herein.
2. Neustar is ordered to assign one (1) NPA-NXX code to Tennessee Telephone in the LaVergne rate center served by Switch Identification No. LVRGTNXARS0, in order to establish an LRN in its newly installed switch.
