INDUSTRIAL CUSTOMERS' RESPONSE TO KINGSPORT MOTION TO MODIFY PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Come Eastman Chemical Company ("Eastman") and Air Products and Chemicals, Inc. ("Air Products"; collectively with Eastman, "Industrial Customers") and respond to the Motion to Modify Procedural Schedule filed by Kingsport Power Company d/b/a AEP Appalachian Power ("KgPCo").

By its Motion of Aug 15, 2012, KgPCo requested that the discovery cutoff be extended to August 31, 2012, and that the deadline for the filing of KgPCo's rebuttal testimony be extended to September 14, 2012. The Industrial Customers do not object to such extensions being granted. However, the Industrial Customers are concerned

that if an extended delay in the scheduling of the hearing in this matter or in its ultimate resolution results, the rights of the Industrial Customers will be prejudiced.

Although no hearing date has yet been established in these combined dockets, the parties previously requested that the hearing be scheduled between September 10 and 19, 2012. The requested extensions will require that the hearing be scheduled at a later date, but conversations with Staff have indicated that a later date would likely be required in any event for reasons unrelated to these dockets.

The Industrial Customers do not object to the modifications to the procedural schedule requested by KgPCo. The Industrial Customers request, however, that the hearing of this matter be scheduled at the earliest date that will accommodate the Authority, its Staff and the other parties without prejudicing the rights of the Industrial Customers. To that end, the Industrial Customers request that the Hearing Examiner convene a scheduling conference
