Dear Mr. Hill:

Please allow this to serve as the City of Knoxville's request for an extension of the briefing schedule and, if possible, reschedule of the oral argument date for the above captioned matter. For cause, the City of Knoxville would show that the briefing schedule overlaps with counsel's long planned out-of-state family vacation and, in any event, does not allow counsel sufficient time to adequately prepare a brief on this matter. Additionally, it may be appropriate, given the change in circumstances of this matter that an amended complaint be submitted to the Tennessee Regulatory agency. An extension of the briefing schedule and rescheduling of the oral argument will not cause any prejudice to AT&T, in that the nature of the City's complaint is that AT&T is responsible for repairing or replacing certain items related to public, educational and governmental cable television channels, in accordance with state law.
