	WAYNE TURNER ON BEHALF OF ATMOS ENERGY CORPORATION
Q:	Please state your name and business address.
A:	My name is Wayne Turner. My business address is 200 Noah Drive, Franklin, Tennessee, 37064.
Q:	By whom and in what capacity are you employed?
A:	I am employed by Atmos Energy Corporation, Kentucky/Mid-States Division ("Atmos") as Operations Manager for the Middle Tennessee region which includes Atmos's operations in the Town of Smyrna, Tennessee.
Q:	Please describe your work history with Atmos.
A:	I have been employed by Atmos for 25 years. I began my career as an appliance installer and have held various positions in Atmos with increasing responsibilities. I have been in my current position for six years.
Q:	Have you previously offered testimony in any regulatory proceedings?
A:	Yes. I provided testimony to this Authority in a docket seeking approval of the Franklin, Tennessee franchise.
Q:	What is the purpose of your testimony in this case?
A:	I am testifying on behalf of Atmos in support of the petition filed to approve the franchise between Atmos and the Town of Smyrna in Docket No

Q: In your capacity as the Operations Manager for the Middle Tennessee region of Atmos, are you familiar with the natural gas distribution system operated by Atmos in Smyrna, Tennessee?

 A: Yes. I am familiar with the operation in Smyrna, Tennessee, as well as the operations in the other surrounding communities that are served by the Atmos system.

Q: Please give the Authority an overall description of the Smyrna, Tennessee system and the customers served.

A: There are approximately 60 customers located within the city limits being served by the natural gas distribution system owned and operated by Atmos. Of that amount, approximately 63% are residential customers and 36% are in other customer classes such as commercial and industrial. There are approximately 331 additional customers located outside of the city limits. Of that amount, about 98% are residential customers and 2% are commercial customers.

The Atmos system consists of approximately 22 miles of pipe within the Smyrna, Tennessee city limits. This pipe is comprised of distribution mains, transmission mains, and service lines. The majority of the pipeline in the Atmos system is located within the public rights-of-way of Smyrna. Without access to these public rights-of-way, Atmos could not adequately maintain, replace and/or operate its distribution system.

Q: Has Atmos operated a natural gas distribution system in Smyrna for a number of years?

A: Yes. Atmos and its predecessor entity have operated for many years in Smyrna under franchise agreements with the Town. The prior franchise agreement, entered into in 1996, Ordinance No. 96-47, allowed Atmos's predecessor entity to operate a gas system within Smyrna and to use the public rights of way of the Town of Smyrna for its distribution system and related plant and access thereto. The United Cities Gas system was transferred to Atmos when the two companies merged in 1997.

Q: Could you please explain the circumstances that caused a need for a new franchise agreement between Atmos and the Town of Smyrna.

A: Yes. Under § 65-26-101 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, Atmos is required to have the consent of the Town of Smyrna, in the form of a municipal ordinance, in order to enter onto the streets and alleys of Smyrna for the purpose of placing, maintaining, or expanding its natural gas distribution facilities. Atmos and its predecessor entity have been providing natural gas service to the Town of Smyrna for the last sixteen years pursuant to the ordinances I have previously mentioned. While the twenty-five year term of Ordinance No. 96-47 is scheduled to expire October 8, 2021, neither the Town of Smyrna nor Atmos has a record of Atmos's predecessor-in-interest's formal acceptance of the 1996 franchise agreement or approval of the 1996 franchise agreement by the

Tennessee Regulatory Authority. When this oversight was brought to the attention of both the Town of Smyrna and Atmos, negotiations ensued to revise the existing agreement to provide for a franchise agreement with Atmos and to obtain the necessary approval from the Tennessee Regulatory Authority. Pending the Tennessee Regulatory Authority's review of the Petition for Approval of the Franchise Agreement with the Town of Smyrna, the Town and Atmos continue to operate on an interim basis, with the Town's concurrence, under the terms of the 1996 franchise agreement, Ordinance No. 96-47, and a new franchise agreement is necessary in order for Atmos to continue its provision of service to the Town of Smyrna into the future.

Q: When did Atmos begin pursuing a new franchise arrangement with the Town of Smyrna?

A: The Company proposed a new franchise ordinance in 2010.

Q: What happened once it was established that both the Town of Smyrna and Atmos were desirous of a continuation of natural gas service to the Town of Smyrna by the Company?

A: Company and Town personnel discussed the proposed franchise on several occasions and the proposed franchise went through several drafts, with both sides making suggested changes to the language. Once the terms of the franchise ordinance were deemed acceptable by both parties, it was scheduled for review and approval by the Town Council. The Ordinance was set for first reading on January 15, 2013. Final approval is expected at the second reading, scheduled for February 12, 2013. Pursuant to the Ordinance, the new franchise agreement will become effective upon final approval by the Town Counsel of the Town of Smyrna, acceptance by Atmos, and final approval by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority. The franchise has a term that runs through December 31, 2021, with two successive five-year renewal terms unless proper notice of intent to renegotiate is provided.

Q: Is the Company satisfied with the franchise agreement as set forth in Ordinance No. 13-02?

A: Yes, and the Company intends to file its acceptance of the franchise with the Town upon final approval by the Town of Smyrna.

38 Q: Does approval by the Town of Smyrna Town Council make the new franchise effective?

A: No. Under § 65-4-107 of Tennessee Code Annotated, Ordinance No. 13-02 is not valid until approved by this Authority.

44 Q: What is the standard to be utilized by the Authority in determining whether to approve Ordinance No. 13-02?

A: Under the statute, the Authority is authorized to approve the ordinance if it finds that it "is necessary and proper for the public convenience and properly conserves the public interest."

Q: In your opinion, are the franchise terms set forth in Ordinance No. 13-02 necessary and proper for the public convenience and in the public interest?

A: Yes, on a number of grounds.

First, the new franchise terms reflected in Ordinance No. 13-02 will establish a long-term arrangement through which the current and future residents, business enterprises and governmental facilities located with the Town of Smyrna will be able to receive, under the supervisory jurisdiction of the Authority, the benefits of continuing natural gas service provided by Atmos for an extended period. This arrangement will help ensure the continuing availability of high-quality natural gas service to the Town of Smyrna for the foreseeable future.

Second, the new franchise facilitates the provision of such natural gas service to the Town of Smyrna by an established and proven provider of that service well known to both the Town of Smyrna and this Authority and possessing the requisite expertise, facilities, systems and gas supply and transportation assets necessary to provide such service.

 Third, the new franchise arrangement establishes adequate and proper mechanisms for access by the Company to public rights-of-way, new and existing customers, and its distribution facilities. These mechanisms help to ensure that Atmos is able to provide both adequate and efficient service and to comply with the requirements of this Authority to ensure the safety and protection of residents and property within the Town of Smyrna.

Fourth, the various other protective provisions set forth in the new franchise arrangement provide useful and important tools for the Town of Smyrna to ensure that its citizens are benefited and not economically harmed by the activities of Atmos within the Town of Smyrna.

Fifth, the new franchise arrangement provides an incentive for Atmos to invest in infrastructure needed to provide improved and expanded service within the Town of Smyrna by ensuring that Atmos will have the right to provide service within these areas for a sufficient period in order to permit Atmos the opportunity to recover the capital investment in such facilities under the rates approved by the Authority.

Q: Could you please summarize your thoughts on the public convenience issue?

A:

Yes. Approval of the new franchise arrangement between Atmos and the Town of Smyrna will ensure that the residents, businesses and governmental entities residing and operating within the Town of Smyrna continue to receive high-quality, safe, reliable and economic natural gas service from a provider with a long and successful history of

providing that service to these areas. The franchise ordinance also provides substantial protections to the citizens of the Town of Smyrna while concurrently offering Atmos a positive incentive to provide ongoing and expanded natural gas service to this area. That service will contribute to a stable infrastructure and expanded economic opportunity and will be beneficial to customers by bringing the desirable attributes of natural gas service to the Town of Smyrna for some time into the future.
