FIRST AMENDED CERTIFICATE OF FRANCHISE AUTHORITY¹

On February 23, 2016, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-301, *et seq.*, also known as the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act (“CCVSA”), Community Television Company (“CTC”) filed with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (“TRA”) an *Amendment to Certificate of Franchise Authority*. This amendment supplements certain municipalities and/or unincorporated areas within counties previously described within its application filed July 16, 2013 and previous amendments, if any, thereto.² As no basis for denial of the amendment under Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-305(i)(1) of the CCSVA has been alleged, the TRA hereby issues the First Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority to supplement the original Certificate of Franchise Authority issued to CTC on August 2, 2013.
