SECOND AMENDED CERTIFICATE OF FRANCHISE AUTHORITY

On October 31, 2019, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-301, *et seq.*, also known as the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act (“CCVSA”), Community Television Company (“CTC”) filed with the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“TPUC”) a *Second Amendment to Certificate of Franchise Authority*. This amendment supplements certain municipalities and/or unincorporated areas within counties previously described within its application filed July 16, 2013 and previous amendments, if any, thereto.¹ As no basis for denial of the amendment under Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-305(i)(1) of the CCSVA has been alleged, the TPUC hereby issues the Second Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority to supplement the original Certificate of Franchise Authority issued to CTC on August 2, 2013, as well as the First Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority issued on March 10, 2016.
