## APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE TO PROVIDE COMPETING LOCAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

Pursuant to applicable Tennessee Statutes and the Rules and Regulations of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority and Section 253 of the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 ("Act"), Crown Castle NG Central Inc. ("Applicant" or "Crown Castle") respectfully requests that the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA") grant to Crown Castle authority to provide competing local telecommunications services within the State of Tennessee. Crown Castle is willing and able to comply with all applicable rules and regulations in Tennessee pertaining to the provision of competing local telecommunications services. TCA 65-4-201.

In support of its Application, Crown Castle submits the following:

#### 2. Organizational Chart of Corporate Structure:

#### 3. Corporate information:

The Applicant, Crown Castle NG Central Inc., is a duly formed corporation, organized under the laws of the State of Delaware. Applicant was originally formed under the name "NextG Networks of Illinois, Inc." on October 4, 2002. On May 3, 2012, the Applicant filed a Certificate of Amendment to change its name to "Crown Castle NG Central Inc." See Exhibit B.

A copy of Applicant's Articles of Incorporation is provided in **Exhibit B**. A copy of Applicant's Authority to transact business in the State of Tennessee is provided in **Exhibit C**. The names and addresses of the principal officers are in **Exhibit D**. There are no officers in Tennessee. The biographies of the principal officers and any other key technical staff are included in **Exhibit E**.

4. Applicant possesses the managerial, technical, and financial ability to provide local telecommunications service in the State of Tennessee as demonstrated below:

#### a. Financial Qualifications:

To demonstrate its financial ability to provide the proposed services, Applicant hereby submits as **Exhibit F** its 2012 financial statements.

With regard to Applicant's projected capital expenditures, Crown Castle does not plan to deploy a system until a customer is under contract. Crown Castle operates on a customer demand basis. Each network will have a unique build-out plan and equipment requirement based on the conditions and technical requirements. Crown Castle cannot estimate the cost of proposed facilities until a build-out plan has been identified. A Corporate Surety Bond in the amount of \$20,000 is provided as **Exhibit G**.

#### b. Managerial Ability:

As shown in **Exhibit E** to this Application, Applicant has the managerial expertise to successfully operate a telecommunications enterprise in Tennessee. As described in the attached biographical information, Crown Castle's management team has extensive management and business experience in telecommunications.

#### c. Technical Qualifications:

Crown Castle has the technical qualifications to provide telecommunications services in Tennessee. Applicant's management has extensive telecommunications experience and training which allows Crown Castle to design and manage its facilities to meet its high service quality standards. (See Exhibit E.)

Although Crown Castle generally establishes a relationship with its customers through duly executed individual case basis contracts, the Company will file and maintain tariffs in the manner proscribed by the TRA. Applicant will not require customers to purchase Customer Provided Equipment, which cannot be used with the Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier's systems.

#### 5. Proposed Service Area:

To date, Applicant has been granted authority to provide telecommunications services in Illinois, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas and Wisconsin. Applicant's affiliates have been authorized to provide service in Arizona, California, Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Indiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Utah, Virginia and Washington. Crown Castle has not been denied authority in any state.

Crown Castle proposes to offer its services throughout the State of Tennessee. Applicant does not plan to offer any form of switched local voice service to either residential or business customers. Crown Castle intends to offer its services through the use of a combination of its own facilities and facilities to be leased from a variety of telecommunications carriers on a technical platform known as a "Distributed Antenna System," or "DAS," which will be explained more fully in the service description provided below in section 6 of this Application.

#### 6. Types of Local Exchange Service to be provided:

By this Application, Applicant seeks authority to provide facilities-based local transport services (hereinafter referred to as "Services") to customers throughout the State of

Tennessee. Crown Castle proposes to provide these Services through a combination of its own facilities and facilities to be leased from a variety of telecommunications carriers.

Applicant's Services will be both jurisdictionally intrastate and interstate and will typically rely on a technical platform known as a "Distributed Antenna System," or "DAS." Crown Castle's "RF transport services" will use fiber optic technology, including multi-wavelength optical technology over dedicated transport facilities, to provide telecommunications companies with transport options. RF transport services connect wireless capacity equipment (i.e., antennas) to bi-directional, RF-to-optical conversion equipment at a hub facility. The hub facility can be customer or Crown Castle-provided. The conversion equipment allows Crown Castle to accept RF traffic from the customer and then send bi-directional traffic transmissions across the appropriate optical networks. At the remote end, Crown Castle or the customer company will provide RF-to-optical conversion equipment to allow bi-directional conversion between optical signals and RF signals. RF signals can be received and radiated at this remote node by the customer company.

The Services are customized to the transport and backhaul needs of individual customers. Tariffed rates will be available for all non-custom services. Applicant does not intend to furnish switched residential or business telephone service.

#### 7. Repair and Maintenance:

Crown Castle recognizes the importance of effective customer service and strives to resolve customer problems in an expeditious, efficient, and cost-effective manner. All of Crown Castle's carrier customers are assigned specific customer service representatives and contact information who handle all customer-specific inquiries. To the extent repair or other issues need to be reported, representatives are available in Crown Castle's Network Operations Center ("NOC") at a toll free number, 1-800-788-7011, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Inquiries and complaints will be routed by the NOC to the appropriate Crown Castle representative.

## 8. Small and Minority-Owned Telecommunications Business Participation Plan: (65-5-212):

Applicant's Small and Minority-Owned Telecommunications Business Participation Plan is attached as **Exhibit H**.

#### 9. Toll Dialing Parity Plan:

Applicant is a transport provider and does not intend to provide switched access dial tone voice service to either residential or business customers. Therefore, Applicant submits that it is not required to submit a toll dialing parity plan under Rule 1220-4-8-.04.

#### Service:

Applicant has served notice of this application to the eighteen (18) incumbent local exchange telephone companies in Tennessee with a statement regarding the Company's intention of operating geographically. *See* Exhibit I for the list.

#### 10. Numbering Issues:

Applicant is a transport provider and does not intend to provide switched access dial tone voice service to either residential or business customers. Applicant does not have a need for NXXs because it will be transporting voice and data for other carriers. Therefore, Applicant submits that this section of the Application is not applicable. (See specific responses in **Exhibit J.**)

#### 11. Tennessee Specific Operational Issues:

Crown Castle will not telemarket its services in Tennessee. Crown Castle is a transport provider and does not intend to provide switched access dial tone voice service to either residential or business customers. Crown Castle's customers are not individual retail consumers, but rather credit rated institutions (primarily major wireless carriers) who lease or purchase facilities and services from Crown Castle. Because Crown Castle is a voice and data transport provider, *i.e.*, a carrier's carrier, Crown Castle submits that the TRA's rules concerning billing for countywide calls and long distance charges do not apply. However, if in the future Crown Castle changes its business plan and decides to offer local voice services to either residential or business customers, Applicant agrees to fully abide by all applicable TRA rules and regulations, including those pertaining to billing and local calling areas. (See specific responses in Exhibit K.)

#### 12. Public Interest:

Grant of this Application and Crown Castle's entry into the local telecommunications marketplace will further the goals of the Tennessee Legislature and further the public interest by expanding the availability of competitive telecommunications services in the State of Tennessee, thereby enhancing the telecommunications infrastructure in the State and facilitating economic development. Moreover, Crown Castle's services are designed in part to enable wireline telecommunications to fill in gaps in wireless coverage without requiring the construction of large towers. Additionally, Crown Castle's presence in Tennessee will increase the incentives for other telecommunications providers to operate more efficiently, offer more innovative services, reduce their prices, and operate more efficiently.

#### 13. Miscellaneous:

- a. Pre-filed Testimony: A copy of Applicant's sworn pre-filed testimony is attached hereto as **Exhibit L**.
- b. Deposits: Applicant does not intend to require customer deposits.

- c. State and federal regulatory complaints: Crown Castle NG Central Inc. has not been subject to any state or federal complaints.
- d. A copy of our tariff is enclosed, and upon approval of this application an official copy of the tariff will be filed.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

Crown Castle respectfully requests that the TRA enter an order granting it a certificate of convenience and necessity to operate as a competing telecommunications service provider and authority to provide facilities-based competitive local transport services, access and nondominant interexchange services throughout the State of Tennessee. For the reasons stated above, Crown Castle's provision of these services would promote the public interest by providing high-quality service at competitive prices and by creating greater economic incentives for the development and improvement for all competing providers.





## SMALL AND MINORITY-OWNED TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUSINESS PARTICIPATION PLAN OF CROWN CASTLE NG CENTRAL INC.

Pursuant to T.C.A. § 65-5-112, as amended, Crown Castle NG Central Inc. ("Crown Castle" or "Company") submits this small and minority-owned Telecommunications business participation plan (the "Plan") along with its Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide competing intrastate and local exchange services in Tennessee.

#### I. PURPOSE

The purpose of § 65-5-112 is to provide opportunities for small and minority-owned businesses to provide goods and services to Telecommunications service providers. Crown Castle is committed to the goals of § 65-5-112 and to taking steps to support the participation of small and minority-owned Telecommunications businesses in the Telecommunications industry. Crown Castle will endeavor to provide opportunities for small and minority-owned Telecommunications businesses to compete for contracts and subcontracts for goods and services. As part of its procurement process, Crown Castle will make efforts to identify and inform minority-owned and small businesses that are qualified and capable of providing goods and services to Crown Castle of such opportunities. Crown Castle's representatives will contact the Department of Economic and Community Development, the administrator of the small and minority-owned Telecommunications assistance program, to obtain a list of qualified vendors. Moreover, Crown Castle will seek to increase awareness of such opportunities so that companies not otherwise identified will have sufficient information to participate in the procurement process.

#### II. **DEFINITIONS**

As defined in § 65-5-112:

Minority-Owned Business. Minority-owned business shall mean a business which is solely owned, or at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the assets or outstanding stock of which is owned, by an individual who personally manages and controls daily operations of such business, and who is impeded from normal entry into the economic mainstream because of race, religion, sex or national origin and such business has annual gross receipts of less than four million dollars (\$4,000,000).

Small Business. Small business shall mean a business with annual gross receipts of less than four million dollars (\$4,000,000).

#### III. ADMINISTRATION

Crown Castle's Plan will be overseen and administered by the individual named below, hereinafter referred to as the Administrator, who will be responsible for carrying out and promoting Crown Castle's full efforts to provide equal opportunities for small and minority-owned businesses. The Administrator of the Plan will be:

#### Maureen Mannion

The Administrator's responsibilities will include:

- (1) Maintaining an updated Plan in full compliance with § 65-5-112 and the rules and orders of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority.
- (2) Establishing and developing policies and procedures necessary for the successful implementation of the Plan.
- (3) Preparing and submitting such forms as may be required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, including the filing of required annual updates.
- (4) Serving as the primary liaison to and cooperate with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, other agencies of the State of Tennessee, and small and minority-owned businesses to locate and use qualified small and minority-owned businesses as defined in § 65-5-112.

- (5) Searching for and developing opportunities to use small and minority-owned businesses and encouraging such businesses to participate in and bid on contracts and subcontracts.
- (6) Providing records and reports and cooperating in any authorized surveys as required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority.
- (7) Establishing a record-keeping system to track qualified small and minority-owned businesses and efforts to use such businesses.
- (8) Providing information and educational activities to persons within Crown Castle and training such persons to seek out, encourage, and promote the use of small and minority-owned businesses.

The efforts to promote and ensure equal opportunities for small and minority-owned businesses are primarily spelled out in the Administrator's duties above. Additional efforts to provide opportunities to small and minority-owned businesses will include offering, where appropriate and feasible, small and minority-owned businesses assistance with technical, insurance, bonding, licensing, production, and deadline requirements.

#### IV. RECORDS AND COMPLIANCE REPORTS

Crown Castle will maintain records of qualified small and minority-owned business and efforts to use the goods and services of such businesses. In addition, Crown Castle will maintain records of educational and training activities conducted or attended and of the internal procurement procedures adopted to support this Plan.

Crown Castle will submit records and reports required by the Tennessee Regulatory

Authority concerning the Plan. Moreover, Crown Castle will cooperate fully with any surveys

and studies required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority.

#### Sworn Pre-Filed Testimony of Robert A. Millar

I, Robert A. Millar, do hereby testify as follows in support of the application of Crown Castle NG Central Inc. for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity as a competing telecommunications services provider to provide telecommunication services throughout the State of Tennessee.

- Q. Please state your name, business address and title.
- A. My name is Robert A. Millar, and my business address is 695 River Oaks Parkway San Jose, CA 95134. My title is Associate General Counsel, for Crown Castle NG Central Inc. ("Crown Castle").
- Q. Please state your qualifications.
- A. In my role as Associate General Counsel, I have personal knowledge of the telecommunications services provided by Crown Castle, Crown Castle's equipment and network, and of their legal and regulatory status. I have been involved with this company and its predecessor for more than 5 years, and been specifically involved in the telecommunications industry since 2000. As a result of my duties in my positions, I have had personal experience and knowledge with requirements imposed by local governments for access to public rights-of-way by telecommunications providers in various communities around the country.

#### Q. What is the purpose of your testimony?

A. The purpose of my testimony is to present evidence describing the technical, managerial, and financial fitness of Crown Castle to provide resold and facilities-based local

exchange and interexchange telecommunications service within the State of Tennessee.

This testimony will also describe the service to be provided by Crown Castle. Finally, my testimony will show that the public interest will be served by the approval of Crown Castle's Application.

- Q. Are all statements in Crown Castle's Application true and correct to the best of your knowledge, information and belief?
- A. Yes, to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief, all statements made in connection with Crown Castle's Application for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity are true and accurate.
- Q. Please describe the current corporate structure of Crown Castle.
- A. Crown Castle NG Central Inc. is a duly formed corporation, organized under the laws of the State of Delaware on October 4, 2002. A copy of Crown Castle's Organizational Chart is attached as Exhibit A to Crown Castle's Application.
- Q. Does Crown Castle possess the requisite managerial, financial, and technical abilities to provide the services for which is has applied for authority?
- A. Yes, Crown Castle possesses the requisite managerial, financial, and technical abilities to provide the services for which it has applied for authority.
- Q. Please describe Crown Castle's financial qualifications
- A. Crown Castle is financially qualified to render the proposed service. Crown Castle has sufficient capital on hand to commence operations in the State of Tennessee and the company has access to additional capital financing as may be needed to sustain future growth and expansion. Crown Castle's business plan calls for the Company to provide its RF transport services based upon direct customer demand. Under this plan, revenue from customers will be readily identified prior to any extensive outlay of capital.

- Q. Please describe Crown Castle's managerial and technical qualifications.
- A. Crown Castle's management team includes individuals with substantive experience in successfully developing and operating telecommunications business. Consequentially, the Company has the adequate internal technical resources to support its Tennessee operations. Specific details of the business and technical experience of Crown Castle's officers and management personnel were attached to the Application as Exhibit E.

#### Q. What services will Crown Castle offer?

- A. Crown Castle will offer transport of voice and data signals via fiber optic lines, initially focused on serving wireless providers. Crown Castle's "RF transport services" use fiber optic technology, including multi-wavelength optical technology over dedicated transport facilities, to provide telecommunications companies with more efficient transport and greater overall network service options. RF transport services connect wireless capacity equipment to bi-directional, RF-to-optical conversion equipment at a hub facility. The hub facility can be customer or Crown Castle-provided. The conversion equipment will allow Crown Castle to accept RF traffic from the customer and then send bi-directional traffic transmission across the appropriate optical networks. At the remote end, Crown Castle or the customer company will provide RF-to-optical conversion equipment to allow bi-directional conversion between optical signals and RF signals. RF signals can be received and radiated at this remote node by the customer company.
- Q. Will Crown Castle offer service to all consumers w/in its service area?
- A. Crown Castle is a carrier's carrier. It does not plan to offer its services to individual residential or business consumers. Crown Castle's customers are primarily large wireless

- carriers with which Crown Castle duly negotiates individual case basis contracts that meet each particular customer's individual needs.
- Q. Does Crown Castle plan to offer local exchange telecommunications services in areas served by any incumbent local exchange telephone company with fewer than 100,000 total access lines?
- A. Crown Castle is a provider of local transport services and seeks authority to provide these services to other carriers throughout the State of Tennessee. As a result, Crown Castle's proposed service area may overlap with an incumbent local exchange telephone company with fewer than 100,000 access lines. However, Crown Castle's services are not traditional switched access voice services, and Crown Castle does not offer access lines. Therefore, Crown Castle's services would not be offered in direct competition with any an incumbent local exchange telephone company.
- Q. Will the granting of a certificate of convenience and necessity to Crown Castle serve the public interest?
- A. A decision by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority to grant Crown Castle authority to provide local exchange and interexchange telecommunications service is in the best interest. The public interest will be served by expanding the availability of competitive telecommunications services and enhanced telecommunications infrastructure in the State of Tennessee, thereby facilitating economic development. Authorizing Crown Castle to enter the telecommunications service market will increase the competitive choices available, and in turn create incentives for all carriers to lower prices, provide new and better quality services, and be more responsive to customer issues and demands.
- Q. Does Crown Castle intend to comply with all TRA rules, statutes and orders pertaining to the provision of telecommunications services in Tennessee, including those for disconnection and reconnection services?

- A. Yes, Crown Castle intends to comply with all TRA rules, statutes, and orders pertaining to the provision of telecommunications services in Tennessee to the extent that they are applicable to Crown Castle's local transport services.
- Q. Has any state ever denied Crown Castle or one of its affiliates authorization to provide intrastate service?
- A. No, no state has ever denied Crown Castle authorization to provide intrastate service.
- Q. Has any state ever revoked the certification of Crown Castle or one of its affiliates?
- A. No state has ever revoked Crown Castle's certification to provide service.
- Q. Has Crown Castle or one of its affiliates ever been investigated or sanctioned by any regulatory authority for service or billing irregularities?
- A. Crown Castle has never been sanctioned or investigated by any regulatory authority for service or billing irregularities.
- Q. Who is knowledgeable about Crown Castle's operations and will serve as Crown Castle's regulatory and customer service contact?
- A. All ongoing compliance matters should be directed to my attention. Customer complaint and billing matters may also be directed to my attention.
- Q. Please explain in detail Crown Castle's proposed procedures for responding to information requests from the TRA and its staff.
- A. Crown Castle is prepared provide the TRA, and its staff, with any supplemental information required and answer any questions raised in order to facilitate the review and certification process.
