I live on 12 acres of land in Akins, Oklahoma. My father, Curtis Roberts, bought this property for his father, Willey "Dock" Roberts, in 1942 when they lost their Indian allotment of 80 acres to pay medical bills. He was serving in the U.S. Army during WWII at the time. After my grandfather and grandmother died, my father settled here. When my mother, Savilla Roberts, passed away in 2010, this property was handed to me. And I will give it to my son, Ronnie Jr., when I leave his world. So, as you can see, this land has been in my family for 72 years.

I've spoken with many neighbors here. Not one has been notified about the proposed project of Clean Line Energy. In fact my closest neighbor is in jeopardy of losing her home and outbuildings if the proposed route is approved. Clean Line brags about the fact they are being honest and open with the landowners but that is not the case.

This project will destroy the natural beauty of this area. I'm doing all I can to see that doesn't happen. I've met with our state senator, our state representative and county commissioner for their help in defeating this proposal.

My property has several Indian mounds on it. This area of Oklahoma is rich in heritage of the Cherokee nation. I'm asking of you to please be respectful of our love of this land and deny Clean Line Energy request to construct a DC transmission line.

Dear Directors,

I am writing to ask your help in stopping Plains & Eastern Clean Line from crossing private land in Oklahoma in order for them to sell power to other states.

It is common knowledge that electric transmission towers on or near real estate decreases the value of the land; the size of the towers and the amount of electricity the lines will carry will ensure that my property will lose value.

Plains & Eastern Clean Line is a private company with private investors that do not care about property rights and plan on obtaining private property with eminent domain. It is my understanding that they are actively attempting to obtain eminent domain from the United States Department of Energy. They have no respect for individual landowners and no respect for individual states, attempting to bypass both and push their project forward for the sake of their investors.

It doesn't make sense to have over 700 miles of high-powered direct current lines strung across the states of Oklahoma and Arkansas to deliver wind power to the southeastern states. The route they are currently pushing for crosses from western to eastern Oklahoma where there are 3 to 9 tornadoes per year. With structures 150 - 200 feet tall every ¼ mile it is a high probability that they will be in the path of one or more tornados.

There is no guarantee that this private company will not pass the rates on to the public in order to fund their project.

A previous attempt from another company wanted to cross several states to deliver power to states in the Northeast. On July 12, 2010 a letter was written from 11 Governors from the Northeast to Senator Harry Reid and Senator Mitch McConnell stating that they did not want new transmission lines from the Midwest to bring wind energy to their states. They wanted to develop their own renewable energy projects rather than to import wind energy from the Midwest. It doesn't appear that other states want these large transmission lines, so why is this company pushing so hard?

I do not want to live near transmission towers that carry 600kv of direct current electricity; I do believe there will be adverse effects on the health of my family, neighbors and livestock. This is a company located in Houston, TX; they don't have these towers next to their homes and I don't want them near my home either.

I moved to Oklahoma in 1986 where I purchased 10 acres of land. I have spent numerous hours cleaning up the land, grooming it, something to be proud. Then in 1999 I built our home overlooking the countryside. I did this work for me and my family, not for private investors that are only interested in making profits.

Again, please stop this project. Please do not bend to the demands of private investors.

I am writing to ask your help in stopping Plains & Eastern Clean Line from crossing my land in Oklahoma with 150' – 200' high-powered direct current power lines.

My husband and I moved to Oklahoma 28 years ago and purchased 150 acres. We sold some acreage to our children and used the remaining 110 acres for raising cattle and hay.

My husband passed away 2 years ago and part of my income is leasing land to other cattle owners. The proposed line will cross over 70 acres of pastureland that I currently lease to other cattle owners. This power line will reduce my income. Not only will this power line affect my monthly income, I will lose the value of my property.

For many years we kept this land clear and I believe this is the reason this privately owned company wants to cross my land; it is already cleared for them. We are the ones that have put in years of work on this land, not them

There is no benefit to me, my family, my neighbors, the city or the state by this power line being strung across the state of Oklahoma. The wind power that will be generated isn't even going to be used in our state.

I am asking you to put an immediate stop to this abuse of my rights as a private landowner.
