Dear Honorable David Jones,



A trail that witnessed much suffering and death as the Cherokee Indians made their way to Oklahoma. This historic landmark runs through our property. Many hardships and great promises were given to the Cherokee Indians during this time. Sequoyah was a great leader of the Cherokee Indians that is why this county was named after him. Those 200 feet transmission lines would be an injustice to the Cherokee Indians historic Trail of Tears.
