ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY TO CONSTRUCT A TRANSMISSION LINE AND TO OPERATE AS AN ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION PUBLIC UTILITY

This matter came before Chair Robin L. Morrison, Vice Chair Kenneth C. Hill, and Commissioner Herbert H. Hilliard, of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the "Commission"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, during a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on September 21, 2018. Plains and Eastern Clean Line, LLC, (the "Company") was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to construct a 17-mile electric transmission line in southern Tipton County and northern Shelby County, Tennessee, and to operate an electric transmission public utility. On July 13, 2018, the Commission received a request from the Company to cancel its CCN due to certain commercial and regulatory events that changed the nature of the Company's project. The Company did not construct the transmission line and, therefore, there are no impacts to Tennessee consumers or businesses. Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the Commissioners voted unanimously to grant the Company's request to cancel its CCN.
