WHEREAS, The proposed Plains & Eastern Clean Line, a high voltage direct current overhead transmission line, will transmit low-cost wind energy from the Great Plains to Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, An increase in the supply of clean, renewable and competitivelypriced electricity will benefit consumers, support economic growth and strengthen the County's sustainability goals; and

WHEREAS, Access to competitive renewable energy resources helps the Shelby County region attract new businesses and industries; and

WHEREAS, The Shelby County region is an air, rail, highway, and river distribution hub and with this project the opportunity to be a distribution hub for renewable energy and sustainable businesses and technologies throughout Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Construction of the Plains & Eastern Clean Line will provide new business opportunities for local construction and service companies; and

WHEREAS, The Shelby County Economic Development Growth Engine Industrial Development Board (EDGE) awarded a payment-in-lieu of tax ([PILOT) incentive to encourage the location of Plains & Eastern Clean Line infrastructure in Shelby County; and

WHEREAS, The Plains & Eastern Clean Line will generate tax revenues for state, county, and local governments in Tennessee and landowners will benefit from payments made for transmission line easements and structures.


