- 4 A: I am testifying on behalf of Atmos in support of the petition filed to approve the modified franchise fee between Atmos and the City of Johnson City.
- Q: In your capacity as the Operations Supervisor for the Johnson City region of Atmos,
 are you familiar with the natural gas distribution system operated by Atmos in
 Johnson City, Tennessee?
- 9 A: Yes. I am familiar with the operation in Johnson City, Tennessee, as well as the operations in the other surrounding communities that are served by the Atmos system.
- 11 Q: Please give the Authority an overall description of the Johnson City, Tennessee 12 system and the customers served.
- 13 A: There are approximately 10,850 customers located within the city limits being served by
 14 the natural gas distribution system owned and operated by Atmos. Of that amount,
 15 approximately 82% are residential customers and 18% are in other customer classes such
 16 as commercial and industrial.

The Atmos system consists of approximately 345 miles of pipe within the Johnson City, Tennessee city limits. This pipe is comprised of distribution mains, transmission mains, and service lines. The majority of this pipe is located within the public rights-of-way of Johnson City. Without access to these public rights-of-way, Atmos could not adequately maintain, replace and/or operate its distribution system.

Q: Has Atmos operated a natural gas distribution system in Johnson City for a number of years?

Yes. Atmos and its predecessor entity have operated for many years in Johnson City under franchise agreements with the City. The franchise agreement Ordinance No. 2726 adopted in 1988 allowed Atmos' predecessor entity to operate a gas system within Johnson City and to use the public rights of way of the City for its distribution system and related plant and access thereto for a twenty-five year period. Ordinance 2726 was amended in 1997 with Ordinance 3511 to modify the franchise fee requirements. Ordinances 3511 and 2726 were further amended in 2003 with the current franchise agreement Ordinance 3869-03. Ordinance 3869-03 further modified the franchise fee requirements and extended the term of the franchise agreement for an additional twenty-five year period. For the past eleven years Atmos has operated a gas system within the City under the franchise agreement Ordinance No. 3869-03, which was approved by the TRA in Docket No. 03-00520.

Could you please explain the circumstances that caused a need for a modified franchise fee between Atmos and the City of Johnson City.

Yes. Atmos and its predecessor entity have been providing natural gas service to the City of Johnson City for the last twenty-six years pursuant to the ordinances I have previously mentioned. Ordinance 3869-03 sets a franchise fee of 3% of annual gross revenue of natural gas sales made, billed and collected by Atmos on all classes of customers who are located within the City limits of Johnson City. The Ordinance further states that, subject to the approval of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, the franchise fee may be modified annually at the election of Johnson City throughout the term of the franchise. The City of

1 Johnson City recently invoked its rights under this provision and, after negotiations with 2 Atmos, an agreement was reached to raise the franchise fee to 5% of natural gas sales 3 made, billed and collected by Atmos on all classes of customers within the City limits of 4 Johnson City, subject to TRA approval. 5 Q: When did these negotiations begin? 6 A: The Company and the City began discussions in summer of 2013 and a modified 7 franchise fee and Resolution by the City of Johnson City followed from those 8 discussions. 9 Q: How does the modified franchise fee compare with the old one? 10 A: The current franchise fee is equal to 3% of Atmos' gross receipts derived from the sale 11 and distribution by Atmos of natural gas within the city limits of Johnson City during the 12 preceding calendar year. The modified franchise fee will adjust this amount to 5%. 13 O: Is TRA approval required for this modified franchise fee? 14 A: Yes. Under § 65-4-107 of Tennessee Code Annotated, and the terms of the Ordinance 15 3869-03, the modified franchise fee will not be valid unless and until approved by this 16 Authority. 17 What is the standard to be utilized by the Authority in determining whether to Q: 18 approve the modified franchise fee? 19 Under the statute, the Authority is authorized to approve the resolution if it finds that it A: "is necessary and proper for the public convenience and properly conserves the public 20

1	Ų:	In your opinion, is the Johnson City modified franchise fee and the terms of the
2		franchise agreement necessary and proper for the public convenience and in the
3		public interest?
4	A:	Yes. The modified franchise fee is necessary to allow the continuation of a long-term
5		arrangement through which the current and future residents, business enterprises and
6		governmental facilities located with the City of Johnson City will be able to receive,
7		under the supervisory jurisdiction of the Authority, the benefits of continuing natural gas
8		service provided by Atmos for an extended period. Approval will ensure the continuing
9		availability of high-quality natural gas service to the City of Johnson City. The other
10		terms of the franchise agreement remain unchanged from what was approved by the
11		Authority in Docket No. 03-00520.
12	Q:	What are you asking the Authority to do in this proceeding?
13	A:	Based on the facts discussed above, we are asking the Authority to approve the modified
14		franchise fee between Atmos and the City of Johnson City as reflected in Exhibit 1 to the
15		Petition in this matter.
16	Q:	Do you have anything further to add to your testimony?
17	A:	Not at this time.
