Notice to Terminate Franchise

Dear Mr. Taylor:

On February 9, 2015, the Tennessee Public Utility Commission ("PUC") issued a certificate of franchise authority to Google Fiber to provide video services to consumers in Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County ("Metro Nashville"). Since then, Google Fiber has been actively building out its network and providing services in Metro Nashville. On September 22, 2020, Google Fiber entered into a local franchise with the government of Metro Nashville to provide fiber optic communications services to consumers in Metro Nashville.

Pursuant to T.C.A. § 47-59-305(h), Google Fiber provides notice that it intends to terminate its state franchise effective November 1, 2020. Google Fiber is simultaneously delivering a copy of this notice to Metro Nashville as required by T.C.A. § 47-59-305(h) and T.C.A. § 47-5-317. Google Fiber has provided all existing customers with ninety days' prior written notice of its plan to terminate video services under the state franchise.
