NAVITAS TN NG, LLC'S RESPONSE TO THE TENNESSEE REGULATORY AUTHORITY'S OCTOBER 7, 2015 DATA REQUEST

COMES NOW Navitas TN NG, LLC ("Navitas"), by and through undersigned counsel, and hereby serves this response to the Tennessee Regulatory Authority's (the "Authority") October 7, 2015 data request.

DATA REQUESTS

REQUEST NO. 1: Please reconcile the 60,411 MCF throughput volumes listed on Schedule 4
Line 1 of the Company's Exhibits for the test period ending December 31,
2014 to the 44,505 MCF gas sold to Navitas's customers listed in Navitas's
most recent ACA Audit in Docket No. 15-00040.

RESPONSE:

The 60,411 MCF figure is the amount of gas that B&W transported in 2014 and 44,517 MCF is the amount that Navitas sold to its customers. The difference is due to several factors. One factor is a leak in Albany Kentucky that was repaired mid-July. The second is the 10% allowed shrinkage in the B&W transport agreement. The third is the hot well gas. Since B&W uses the majority of the pipeline quality gas coming off of the Spectra line and replaces that usage with their well head gas which is more energy dense there is discrepancy in Navitas customers' usage measured in ccf and the MMBtu content of the gas they received. The customers' meters register less usage since the gas is richer. The btu/ccf factor on the spreadsheet is from Spectra. We do not know the btu/ccf factor for the well gas. Lastly, Navitas in unaware of who pays for the supply and the transport for the free consumers on the B&W line. If Navitas does pay for it than it would affect the line loss as well.

REQUEST NO. 2: Please reconcile the 49,937 MCF of Albany throughput volumes listed on B&W's Response to CAD Data Request No. 2 Question 21 Attachment C to the 32,525 MCF of Albany volumes listed in Navitas's most recent ACA Audit in Docket No. 15-00040.

REQUEST NO. 3: Separate the volumes listed on Schedule 4 Line 1 of B&W's Exhibits by individual location (Albany, Byrdstown, Fentress and Whitley County).

RESPONSE:

Please see attached PDF. In 2014, there were no Whitley county customers outside of Albany. The Sales figures are from Navitas' billing system and the city gate usages and direct connect usage is provided by B&W. Please note the negative line loss in Brydstown and large positive loss on the direct connect customers. Even combining these figures provides a negative line loss on the Tennessee side of the B&W pipeline.

REQUEST NO. 4: Provide the specific geographic location (city and state) of the two expected new industrial customers.

RESPONSE:

The two new industrial customers, both of whom are operating and taking gas, are located on the Albany systems, Cobb feed mill is in Albany proper, Keystone foods is located on Hwy 90 between Hwy 127 and Road 1590 (commonly called the Burkesville Road.


